P. H. Cook was Representative from F. 7 in 1862

Sheep Cook listed in 1829 Census with 6 in family -

William Hopkins in 1790 Census - 3 in family

Edrington History of Fairfield gives the following

Col. William J. Alston married again in 1852 Miss Susan P. Cook, the beautiful and affable daughter of the late Gen. Phillip Cook, they had three children, Phillip Cook, a most estimable youth, who died of consumption in 1874, Hannah Kirkland, a girl of unusual, lovely character, firm, yet gentle and patient who died June 10, 1876. Joseph Kirkland Alston the only surviving child of this marriage, last year was admitted to the bar of S.C. & is now engaged in practice of law in Columbia

He also mentions a Martha Williamson daughter of Roland (?) Williamson who resided at Simpsons Turnout. She married Osmond Woodward youngest son of John Woodward. They raised no sons, tho had several. The daughters were Jimima, Sallie, Lucy & Regina.
