Patch to be ten rou long and teo broad and e quarter of an acer of flax and a half an acor of turnips, both with her sons and she has liberty to chose her flax in the blossom and turnips at four weks age and a house to live in by her self if she sees cause and fire wood during her single life. But if my wife Margaret should marry another man, she is to quit claim to all but her third of my moveable estate only. Griffith with the land and meadow ground up the run as fer as my Land goes from a marked ghite oak on the South of my clear ground except the Timber hill joining Conrad fouts Elso if thet is not medow ground sufficiente I alow ten acors of medow ground down the run next the saw mill also I slow to my young son Peter the land I live on at his arrival to age, providing slways that ave two sons Adam and Petter shall at their sellings Land praise the lands together and pay to my two daughters, Eve and Elizabeth, the one half of the whole appraisements to be equally devided between my two daters for which provise to be fullfilled,

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I give and bequeath to my two sons or to their and assigns forever all the above said lands. Further I do Impower and alles my wife Hergerstefer with George Kins in York Town and Gounty to be my shole and make cold too for executor of this my lest Will and festament. Farther I alow my house and lat in Lancaster to be repaired and sold to the best advantage.

Griffith with the land meadow ground up the run as far as my land goes from a marked white oak on the South of my clear ground except the Timber hill joining Conrad Fouts also if that is not medow groudnd sufficient I alow then acors of medow ground down the run next the saw mill, also I alow to my young son, Peter, the land I live on at his arrival to age, providing always that my two sons Adam and Peter shall at their sellings Land praise the lands together and pay to my two daughters, Eve and Elizabeth, the one half of the whole appraisements to be equally divided between my tow daters for which proviso tp be fulfilled.

I give and bequeath to my two sons or to their heirs and assigns forever all the above said lands. Further I do impower and alow my wife, Margaret, with George Kins in York Town to be my whole and said executors of this my Last Will and Testament. Further I alow my ' houses and lot in Lancaster to be repaired and sold to the best advantage.
