WILL OF DANIEL HUFFMAN SENIOR

State of South Carolina Fairfield District

1, Daniel Huffman Senior, of the state and district aforesaid, being weak in lody but of sound and disposing mind and merory, being desirous to dispose of such worldly effects as I am possessed of, do make and ordain this my Last Will and Testament in the manner and form following, Viz.

In the first place I allow all my Property to be Sold at the discretion of my Executors except Such as is hereinafter names and out of the Monies arising therefrom I allow all my just debts and funeral expenses to be paid

I give and bequeath to my wife Elimabeth during her Natural Life the plantation whereon I now live, containing two hundred acres more or less. Also the foll wing Negros, Viz., Gin., Esther and Rueien, one Sorrel mare, four Head of cows, and calves, all my Stock of Hoggs. All my beds and their furniture all my Household Kitchen furniture and all my plantation To: ls and farming Utensils Together with four head of young cattle Suitable for beef. al: my corn and fodder and as much Money out comy crop of cotton as will be Sufficient to Lay her in a Suffient portion of Coffee, Sugar and Salt for the next year this to be done at the descretion of my Executors hereinafter to be named. Should there Remain any money out of the Sales of my property as aforesaid after paying all my Just debts and funeral expences I allow the Same to be put to interest by my Executors until the decease of my wife at which Time I allow all the above named property divised to be sold at the discretion of my Executors and the Monies arising therefrom, together with money as may be in the hands of my Executors to be divided in the following manner. Viz.

I leave and bequeath to my Son Daniel the sum of twenty dollars

I leave and bequeath to my Son Alexander the Sum of fifty dollars

I leave and bequeath to my Daughter, Mary Cork, wife of John Cork, four Hundred dollars

I leave and bequeath to my Daughter, Elizabeth Cork, the wife of James Cork, the Sum of fifty dollars

I leave and bequeath to my Son David ten dollars

I leave and bequeath to my Son John the Sum of five Hundred dollars to be retained in the hands of my Executors and given to him as they may deem necessary or his Circumstances Should Require it for any of the Comforts or necessaries of Life

I leave and bequeath to my Daughter, Margaret Killpatrick, the wife of John Killpatrick, the Sum of ten dollars

I leave and bequeath to my Grandson Daniel Huffman, Son of my son Alexander, a Negro Girl named Martha

Lastly, I Constitute my Son David Huffman my Sole Executor of this my last will and Testament hereby Revoking and disannulling all other wills heretofore by me made.

Witness my hand and Seal this 20th day of April 1830.
