GROSHY -- harly History

The name "Crosby" means "Town of the Cross", and originated by a cross being placed in the ground by a very devout body of worshipers, who went regularly to worship God, they at that time did not have churches as we do today. Folk who watched these "queer" people go to this place of worship so frequently, called them "Cross-by" people or sometimes spoke of them as "Worshipers-by-the-Cross",. Later, they were given the name Crosseby, then Crosslie, Crossby and finally Crosby, as we spell it today.

There are eight towns or hamlets named Crosby across the waters. They are as follows:

- 1. Crosby ---- In Lincolnshire, south of Hugber.
- 2. Crosby Garret - 16 miles east of Ulleswater.
- 3. Crosby - Ravensworth.
- 4. Crosby - - 4 miles north of Carlisle.
- 5. Crosby - - In Cumberlands.
- 6. Crosby - - In Lancashire (Little and Great Crosby)
- 7. Crosby - - Kilbride (Scotland)
- 8. Crosby - - Small hamlet in center of Isle of Man.

The first Crosby mentioned in history, is Geoffery De Crosseby, Lincolnshire Co., England, in the hundred rolls or the tax lists for the year 1273. The next place the name is recorded, is that Thomas De Crosseby was a poll tax payer of Yorkshire in 1379.

Following this we have an endless history of the people of this name. Sir John Crosby's history of his life work is very interesting. He was a man of great wealth and influence. He bought land from the Catholics in 1466, built "Crosby Hall" — one of the most beautiful buildings in London for years. Here royalty were entertained on many occasions. Sir John was first a woolman by trade, but was later made a knight. He was employed by King Edward many times to meet and decide important matters with the Duke of Burgundy, as it has been said that a Crosby is level-headed in matters of great importance.

Crosby Hall is a medieval Gethic Structure, built in Bishopgate Street, in London, and was the scene of a portion of Shakespeare's Richard KII.

Sir Thomas Moore also wrote Utopia in Crosby Hall. Some of the original chambers still remain today, but it is used as a restaurant.

In the Public Library in Philadelphia there is a description of Crosby Hall, also Sir John's will, which is very fascinating indeed. The will is the most elaborate document one could find, and is very leng, as he was a man of wealth.

He died in 1475.

The first Crosby to come to America was Simon Crosby, who settled in Cambridge, Mass. in 1635. With him was his wife, Ann, and their son, Thomas; Simon being twenty-six years of age and Ann Twenty-five, little Thomas only eight months.

They came on the ship "Susan and Allyn", which only carried 94 passengers. It was said he bought a large amount of money with him and made wise investments.

He left three sons --- Thomas, Simon, and Joseph Crosby.

Whereas I, Margaret Crosby on 12-14-1813 in the presence of Thomas Moorman and Moses Crosby executed a writing under seal purporting that my late husband, Thomas Crosby, had by this last will and testament given and bequeathed to his son Ezekial with other property to him and his heirs forever. And where as the said John Crosby died during his minority and without heirs of his body, in the year 1795 (though in the writing stated by mistake to be in the year 1787) and at which time by parole will he gave bequeathed the said mulato man slave, Ezekial, to his younger brother Allen Crosby. And whereas the said slave by the laws of the land of that day, was vested in one as my right and property. I do hereby fully confirm the said gift of the said John Crosby as before set forth and stated in the said Allen Crosby relinquishing all claims or claim which I or any person may have in the said mulato slave Ezekial, absolutely to him and his heirs forever and at the same time it is to be fully understood that the said confirmation and transfer of the said slave is not in any way to debar him at my death from having a full share of my property over and above the value of the said slave Ezekial. I am not considering him as a part of the estate by one to be given to him. Given under my hand and seal this 18th day of July in the year of our Lord 1823.

COLEMAN CROSBY

Coleman Crosby married Adeline Walker 8-15-1837. He was born 2-16-1807. Died at his home in Chester District on Monday 1-30-1860. He was 53 years of age, lived and wied within one mile of his birth place. The whole energies of his nature were worthily bestowed upon the performance of his duties to his family, his friends, his neighbors, and his country. He was a member of the Methodist Church. Mary Adeline Walker, his wife, was born in 1822, died June 17, 1889.

After Coleman Crosby's death his wife married Berryman Withers. Coleman and Adeline Crosby had seven children: John Alexander, Louise, Josephine, Stephen, William Walker, Mary Arbella, and Ida Grosby.

Stephen, the third child of Coleman and Adeline Crosby, enlisted with the Chester Blues in Chester County, with E. C. McClure as Captain, at the age of 18, on April 18, 1861. He was in Company I-th Regiment S.C.V. Bratton's Brigade. He was wounded twice, once through his leg and once through his shoulder. had a hole shot through his hat at Seven Pines, Va. Was captured after second battle of Manassas in Leesburg. The Court House was used during the war as a hospital. He escaped the morning after being placed there, and went to Winchester, Va., and joined the Confederate forces there. He was with Lee when he surrendered at Appoint to Court House. He received his discharte 4-9-1865. Stephen Crosby spent his last days with his daughters, Mrs. L. B. Jeter and Mrs. Belle Crosby Speats-Going.

Stephen Crosby and his wife, Sara Catherine Meador Hason Drucilla Meador

(Every one for whom she was named, gave her a negro slave.) She was born Aug. 18, 1845, Died 6-16-1925, married 11-9-1865. Resided a few years in Fairfield County, South Carolina, then moved to Union, South Carolina.
