

C. E. Dixon, 67, Passes Saturday

Charles Edward Dixon, 67, died about two o'clock Saturday at his home in Winnsboro. He had a chronic heart condition, but his death was unexpected, and he had just returned from a motor trip to Florida.

Mr. Dixon was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. B. F. Dixon, was born in Union County on June 9, 1888.
