I Tillman L Dixon Being in bad health and calling to mind the uncertainty of life, do make this my last will in the following manner & form, My will is that all my property real and personal be equally divided between my seven Children and if one or more of them should die without leaving a child or children or lawful heir of their Body, their Dividend of my estate shall be equally divided among those of my Children (or their Children) who may survive them, and my will is that the property of my daughter shall continue in their possession during their life and after their death it shall go to their Children and that no debts of the husband of my daughters, or contracts of any kind shall prevent my daughters from retaining in their possession any portion of their Dividend arising from my Estate and I will that all my property shall be kept together under the direction of my executors till my children become of age or marry then to receive their dividend and I do hereby appoint my Brother William Dixon, Dixon Barnes & John B. Barnes my lawful Executors with full power to carry into execution my will, witness my hand and seal October the thirtieth in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & fifty one - 1851
