KNOW YE, That in pursuance of an Act of the Legislature, entitled "An Act for establishing the mode of granting the lands now vacant in this State, and for allowing a commutation to be received for some lands that have been granted," passed the 10th day of February, 1791; **WE HAVE GRANTED,** and by these presents **DO GRANT** unto *Stephen Nolen Jun^r* his heirs and assigns, a plantation or tract of land containing *fourteen acres surveyed for him the 27 March 1819 situated in Fairfield District on the heads of some drains or sources of Little River*
