

1. John Douglas, our grandfather, was born in Bellymana, Antrim County, Ireland, about 1789. He was brought to this county when an infant. He died October 26th, 1872, at his home in Fairfield County, S. C., four miles east of Blackstock, where he owned a great deal of land and many slaves. He was married Feb. 11th, 1819 to Grace Jane Brice. The names of their children are as follows:

Her husband, John Douglas, died fifteen years later. He was noted for his great physical strength and piety and strict observance of Sunday.

2. Mollie Douglas never married, nothing more said.

3. William Douglas married a Miss Mobley contrary to the wishes of his family. It is said that the objection was on account of some idiotic or idiosyncratic tendencies of the Woman. But William Douglas realized that he was not in the Old Country, but on Free America where every man has greater liberty and is more of a sovereign, than a king, in the fact that he picks his own wife. William Douglas was a doctor and was said to have been^a very intellectual man, but many of his children were lacking in the due amount of common sense.

4. James Douglas never married, but the historians did not treat him as badly on account of this as they did his sister Mollie.

We find the aesthetic nature of James Douglas highly cultivated; while he might not have admired or become infatuated over the beauty of women, he did love beautiful flowers and that he would try to get every variety he ever saw or heard of.

He had much wealth in lands, slaves, livestock, etc. He was in sympathy with the Union Army instead of the Confederates. When he heard that Sherman's Army was in Atlanta, Ga., he said he would bid them God speed when they got to Fairfield County, but when they got there they completely devastated his estate, leaving him practically nothing; burnt all of his cotton, carried off all of his livestock, with the exception of one cow which they plowed all day and milked every morning and night. There being no stock left but this one cow, it was hard to make use of his farm and slaves. It was said that he could be heard mourning in his room at night and finally died of a broken heart, though an old man.

He would not ask a blessing at the table, until he had a serious spell of sickness and after this he began, but with the same breath he said "Amen", he told his wife to start the dishes moving. But he is said to have been a very intellectual man, a good historian and an active, energetic man. He succeeded well in business, He was a farmer. Most of his descendants are getting along well in the world, both intellectually and financially.

H. Robert Leroy Douglas was born May 31st, ¹⁸³⁵1935. He graduated at Davidson College, N. C. and then at the Theological Seminary at Columbia, S. C. He was preaching at Union, S. C. where he had been pastor for about three years, when returning from a fall meeting of Presbytery, in his buggy, in the year 1866, he got sick and stopped at Rev. Mr. Sayes in Chester County, S. C. where he died after one week's sickness. The body was carried to the home of his father, John Douglas, where he was till living four miles East of Blackstock, S. C. At the end of service held there the Thirty-Ninth Psalm was read. He was buried at Catholic Presbyterian Church where his father was an Elder.

This now includes all under No. 1 A to H and ends the children and grand children of John Douglas, the son of Alexander Douglas. We shall come back and take up their children, after we take up the families of those related to Alexander Douglas in the same degree that John Douglas is related to him.

He was a Presbyterian Minister but got on so poorly he soon left that Church and went to the A.R.P. Church, where he preached for a short time, but as he got on no better there, he gave up preaching entirely, and went to teaching school, and failed there so completely at this that the patrons asked him to stop before his time was out. This he refused to do, so the patrons stopped their children but James Douglas continued to go to the Schoolhouse and sit there his required time. Then the patrons looked up the building but this failed to baffle James Douglas for he continued to sit the allotted time on the doorsteps and at the end of the term drew his full salary. He died in the spring of 1903. He, like his father, picked a very foolish and unattractive wife, who with their children, are said to be still living in the upper part of York County, S. C. in ignorance.
