When he heard that Sherman's Army was in Atlanta, Ga., he said he would bid them God speed when they got to Fairfield County, but when they got there they completely devasted his estate, leaving him practicall; nothing; burnt all of his cotton, carried off all of his livestock, with the exception of one cow which they plowed all day and milked every morning and night. There being no stock left but this one cow, it was hard to make use of his farm and slaves. It was said that he could be heard mourning in his room at night and finally died of a troken hears, though an old man.
