Died at the residence of Major Storke near Columbia, Mrs. Martha L. Peay, wife of Col. N. A. Peay of Fairfield District 81 years old, leaving 6 children

Died July 26, 1859 James Ross only child of J. A. and M. G. Hendrix aged 11 months.

On Thursday evening 2nd (no place or date) Rev. M. D. Fraser m. O. R. Thompson and Martha Hudson, eldest dau. of Charles Laughlin all of this place.

Departed 26th of July, 1859 after a short illness James Ross (note above)

Died in Bryan Co. Aug. 13, Emily Marbury, aged 2 years

Aug. 14 James Randolph aged 1 year only children of Mary L. and Rev. James S. Cozby

Died at Blackstocks, S.C. 22nd Aug. 1873 Mrs. Agnes Morrison, dau. of the late Col. Wm McCreight of Fairfield Co. age 70 years. Member Scion Pres. Church, Winnsboro

Died Mrs. Jane Martin Turner, consort of James Herron a native of Fairfield District, S.C. she moved to La. (Bossier Parish) in 1846 Died 10th July 1866 leaving 6 children, 2 lovely babies buried in S.C. Member Lebanon Pres. Church.

Died in Washington City, Mrs. Rebecca Frances Wills, wife of Rev. David Wills, DD, Chaplain U.S. Army. She was 49. Born and educated in S.C. United with the Moreb Presbyterian Church in Fairfield District during a meeting conducted by the Rev. Palmer, then of Columbia. Married 1847 7 children. She was the sister of the Rev James B. Watt. Sister-in-law of Rev. James Castles of York Co. Eldest dau wife of the Rev. Thos. W. Hollingworth of Atlanta.

Sergeant John W. Robb 6th Regiment S.C. fell Jan. 30 21 years old (no yr. given)

Died Fairfax Court House, Va. 8th Aug. Baily Dixon of Liberty Flat Rock Guards 2nd S.C. regiment Hill S.C. aged 20 yrs. Fallen a sacrifice for his beloved South

From the Charleston Courier Died James H. Thornwell DD 50th yr. Born 8th Dec. 1812 in Marlboro District Entered S.C. College at an advanced age graduated 1831 May 1835 instated in ancesterville, S.C. 1837 chair of logic, rhetoric and belles lettres in the S.C. College in place of the lamented Nott Retired 1839 1840 Episcopal chair in Ga. 1851 pastorship of Glebe Church in Charleston

Died in Winnsboro Dec. 16, 1876 Mrs. Margaret F. Law, wife of James W. Law dau of the late Rev. Malcom D. Fraser In her 18th year joined Scion Pres. Church Six days before her death her uncle John A. Crawford and one day before her death her aunt Miss Jane Crawford died in Columbia. Her 2 month old infant died Jan. 28

Eleanor E. Barkley, consort of Rufus Barkley 26th year of her age.

Capt. James Monroe Phinney Company G, 6th Regiment, S.C. volunteers. Battle of Chickahominy 31st May, 1862. Native of Winnsboro, S.C. and in his twenty-ninth year of age. Leaves a young wife and two small children.

Thomas J. Boggs, son of Rev. G. W. Boggs Boyce Guards, 6th Regiment, S.C.V. Near Richmond June, 1862 20th year of his age.

Dr. J. R. Boulware, died at his residence near Gladden's Grove. Graduate of Charleston Medical College Resolution on the loss of Dr. Boulware was passed by the Mt. Olivet Pres. Church Dec. 5th, 1869

Died Wm C. Buchanan adjutant 12th Regiment, South Carolina volunteers Home was in Winnsboro. Died in battle.
