Will OF ELIZA JANE DOUGLASS (Fairfield County, SC Will Book W, Page 426, Filed 10-29-1894)

## State of South Carolina

I, ELIZA JANE DOUGLASS, of the County of Fairfield and in the State aforesaid, being of sound mind and disposing memory, do make and declare the following to be my last Will and Testament.

<u>First.</u> I will, devise and bequeathe all my real and personal estate to my still unmarried daughters, SALLIE B., LIZZIE E and MAGGIE J. DOUGLASS, as long as they remain unmarried and should either, me or more of them marry, the others or other remaining single or unmarried, to have the exclusive use and enjoyment of said property as long as they or she may live, and at the death of the last surviving one of said daughters, who may remain unmarried, or upon the marriage of all of them, if they should marry, I will and direct that all of said property shall be dqually divided among all of my children who may be then living, except my son JOHN A. DOUGLASS, (who has received his of my estate,) but should either of my children, except my son -JON, die before the time for such division of my estate, leaving issue, who may be then living, it is my will, and I so direct, that such issue shall take the share of said estate to which the parent would have been entitles to, had he or she been living at the time for such division.

<u>Second.</u> I will and direct that in case my husband CHARLES DOUGLASS survive me, that he shall have a home where I now live, and a support from my estate as long as he shall live, and the devise and bequest in the \_\_\_\_\_\_ is subject to this provision for him, and it is my will that the division of my estate herinbefore directed shall not take place until after the death of my said husband. *hultimbefore* 

<u>Third.</u> I nominate and appoint my son JOHN A. DOUGLASS to be the executor of this my last Will and T4estament.

Witness my hand and seal this in the 17th day of September in the year of our Lord, one thousand, eight hundred and ninety.
