DURHAM

From the Manchester Papers, page 36.

Letter October 18, 1620 from THOMAS DURHAM to Sir NATHANIEL RICH telling of the death and funeral of his brother ROBERT RICH who had been treated by ED. ATHEN (?) a blood physician or rather a quack salver. Mr. DUTTON was Executor and had not given the deceased due honours at the funeral. He had not the honesty or the manners to write Mr C. KENDAL, Mr. SEMER (probably WIL-LIAM SEYMOUR, the first of his name in Bermuda) gave him a volley of shot at his burial but was not offered so much as a cup of aqua vitae or anything else by DUTTON according to the ancient and laudable custom which heretofore hath been used at burials. DURHAM, himself, however got out some liquor of his own to make such friends drink as came to the burial. DURHAM requests Sir NATHANIEL to go to the Herald's College and have his brother's Arms drawn and sent out for the purpose of having a solemn funeral performed.

Note: This letter proves that both WILLIAM SEY-MOUR and THOMAS DURHAM were settled in Bermuda in 1620.

HENRY DURHAM married to JUDITH HUNT, February 14, 1660

Notes: It seems probable that the DURHAM family in Bermuda descended from HENRY & JUDITH DURHAM as within the memory of the late WILLIAM HALL DARRELL some of the lands in Southampton were occupied by a Mrs HUNT and Mrs ELIZABETH DURHAM.

JUDITH HUNT was the daughter of Governor RICH-ARD HUNT and his wife FRANCES. They were the first HUNTS in Bermuda. Another HUNT daughter, SARAH married THOMAS GIBBS.

JUDITH DURHAM daughter of HENRY & JUDITH married JOHN WILKINSON

HENRY & ELIZABETH DURHAM (possibly this is HENRY the son) held several shares of land in Southampton in 1688

In 1690 WILLIAM RIGHTON of Burlington in Province of West Jersey in the parts of America, CRAFT & THOMAS LEACRAFT on the West Side, each 40% Executors each 45. JONOTHAN TUCKER & JOHN KING, Executors. Witnesses: GEORGE TUCKER, SAM DAFFYE. Proved Dec 8, 1697

GRIMDITCH

Will of MARGARET GRIMDITCH of Bermuda but -now, November 8, 1653, a resident of Barbados. To son THOMAS HARRIOTT 10 acres of the 50 that I own in Port Royal Bermuda and 1 negro. The remainder

of estate to dear friend ARCHIBALD JOHNSON.

Note: This THOMAS HARRIOTT was possibly the son of the Mathematician who was companion of the Earl of Northumberland while he was confined in the Tower of London, 1611

GUISE

Will of NEHEMIAH GUISE, May 6, 1686 Book 2, page 63. Whole estate to three sisters, SUSANNAH NEW-BOULD, ELIZABETH TODD or TRAD MIRIAM MUSSONE. Executors: THOMAS HARFORD & PAUL NEWBOULD Witnesses: WILLIAM STONE, JOHN KIDGELL Proved January 26, 1693.

Note: The MUSSON family is not believed to have been settled in Bermuda at as early a date as this.

GULDEN or GOULDEN or GOULDING or GOLDING or GOLDIN

Goulden Book V (A) p. 351. This is to certify that JOHN GOULDEN son of WILLIAM GOULDEN, Minister, was baptised, April 23, 1630 as you will find by the Register Book of Smiths Tribe. THOS WELLS Counseilor, July 16, 1670.

Goulding Lefroy Vol 2 p. 51. Letter confirming PER-CIVAL GOULDING as a pious teacher for school in Devonshire Tribe. Extract from Proclamation by the Governor March 3. 1659

ME PERCIVAL BOULDING SHOW AS PRESENT AT Mr. JONOTHAN BURR. Teacher and whoever will send their children unto him he will trach them English & Latin and write & last scourus for nothing Thus festiring every person in the Is ands that desires their children to be tracted up in knowledge and fear of the lord to send their pulities a to them to be educated that we may leave a Generation behind us to praise and glorify the Lord when we are in the dust. In 1601 NORWOOD whom GOULDING had succeeded, was reinstated and the latter was given notice to provide another habitation for himself. About the same time GOULDING's wife was presented at the Assizes on suspicion of adultery She was censured by the Counsellor, FRANCIS WATLINGTON of Devon. Tribe. In 1681 GOULDING is described as very old and unable to execute his place as formerly so JAMES HILL is appointed assistant schoolmaster

Goldin EPHRAIM GOLDIN in passenger list, sloop 'Experience,' LEONARD WHITE Master, Bermuda to Barbados, June 10, 1987. THOMAS HILTON) £40 to be paid to her 20 days after her marriage by her brother SAMUEL HUB-BARD (married MIRIAM PENISTON) in goods, slaves or money, also one Feather Bed, bolster & pillows and bedstead with curtains and Valence with 3 pair sheets and 2 pair pillow bares and till the time of marriage, she shall have her living and mainteance in my Mansion House with her brother SAM-UEL HUBBARD.

Daughter LOVE HUBBARD (married Capt. LEON-ARD WHITE) same as above.

Daughter SARAH (second wife of SAMUEL TROTT of Walsingham) same

To three daughters now married, JANE TUCKER (married ST GEORGE TUCKER, the first in Bermuda) ELIZABETH WILLIS and MARY VAUGHAN (married HENRY VAUGHN, Minister) f10 each in remembrance of me.

Son DANIEL (married SARAH TUCKER, widow of NICHOLAS HINSON) one share land north by Mr SAM TROTT with all houses belonging when he shall be 21 yrs & until then his brother SAM shall maintain him & bring him up to a trade when he is done schooling. (Note: Five years later he was a goldsmith)

My will is that the long table in the Hall shall remain in the Mansion House but all moveables to be sold at decease of wife. Rest & residue between 3 youngest daughters: CHARITY, LOVE & SARAH. DANIEL to have a feather bed when he marries.

Wife JANE (nee LEACRAFT, see above) and friend RICHARD STAFFORD of Hamilton Tribe and son SAMUEL Executors. Proved August 2 1705.

Notes: The son SAMUEL married MIRIAM PEN-ISTON daughter of RICHARD. She married secondly JOHN BAILEY and with him emigrated to Pennsylvania. DANIEL had two sons JOHN and DANIEL and two daughters REBECCA (married THOMAS OUTERBRIDGE) and JANE (married GILES CORBUSIER)

SAMUEL & MIRIAM PENISTON had a daughter MIRIAM born 1694 and in 1709 she then being 15 yrs of age chose her uncle DANIEL HUBBARD to be her guardian. Her petition mentions that her mother & stepfather are now in Pennsylvania

Virginia, Feb 1683. JOHN HUBBARD witness to a deed of sale ROBT. COBB to MICHAEL MAS-TERS.

June 12, 1679. Memo that Capt JOHN HUBBARD Senior, JOHN BRISTOW Junr, SAMUEL TROTT, PERIENT TROTT Junr, Capt ANDREW COLL-YARD, ARTHUR JONES, THOMAS OUTER-BRIDGE, & WILLIAM SMITH, Chirugian, interested in a negro boy called 'Tome' did freely give & bestow upon Sir JOHN HEYDON Knight, the aforesaid 'Tome' him the said negro to hold & use for his own & his heirs & administrators for the term of 99 years if the said 'Tome' shall so long live for in consideration of favours by the said Sir JOHN HEYDON afforded unto the gentlemen aforesaid. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand this day & year above said.

February 26, 1686. Be it known to those whom it may concern that I, WILLIAM EDWARDS in Somers Island, Clerk, have before witnesses joined ROBERT HUDSON and SARAH FFARMER in the holy estate of matrimony.

HENRY DURHAM who was made Governor of Bermuda in November 1682 on the death of Gov. FLORENTIUS SEYMOUR married SARAH-HUNT who with her father and mother RICHARD & SARAH HUNT of Bromley, Kent, arrived in Bermuda, 1647

(Note: The above statement was given in Obituary notice of HENRY GILBERT HUNT, Royal Gazette, December 2. 1651, but I found in Port Royal Records that HENRY DURHAM married JUDITH HUNT February 14, 1660 and in will of RICHARD HUNT (Old Book No. 3, p. 1) proved 1687 he claimed HENRY DURHAM as his son in law. J. E. Mercer) Another note dated Dec 11, 1677 speaks of RICHARD HUNT & his wife FRANCES (possibly a second observation of the formed GIPPS & SARAH for wife, Son in law HENRY DURHAM & JUDITH his wife.

Colonial Relie Vol 2 of 26. March 1st 1638 ROBERT HUNT swire that EDWARD CHAPLIN & THOMAS SHARPE came out to serve for seven years as servants of EDWARD BURGES.

Port Royal Records: 1674 Baptism May 21 FRANCES daughter of NA-THANIEL HUNT 1676 Baptism Aug 23 NATHANIEL son of NA-THANIEL 1681 Baptism Feb 3 ANGELINA daug. NATHAN-IEL HUNT.

Letter dated May 18, 1683. Brother STRINGER: I being on board RICHARD HUNT's vessel to search for tobacco I found there several barrels oyle whereof I have attached them. The matter is for them to prove where they had that oyle. Therefore I require you forthwith to come to town & put me in security for all damage that may happen in the taking of the said oyle ashore, thereofe fail me not for I will wate at towne this day for your coming, so I rest, your friend & brother, JOHN HUBBARD, Sheriff.
