I find it quite interesting that this family started out in Fairfield.) istrict, S. C. and ended up in Fairfield, Texas. I recently learned that Fairfield, Texas was named for Fairfield, Alabama. I am writing to the library in Fairfield, Alabama in efforts to learn how the latter city got its name. I was wondering if you could tell me how your county got its name.
