- DONAHOE, EDMUND [or EDWARD] (16??-1748) married Ann Tippet, daughter of Thomas
Tippet (16??-1710). Her sister, Abigail Tippet, married in 1714 John
Green (q.v.); neither were named in the will of their father, Thomas Tip-
pet, which was dated 15 February 1699 and proved 6 December 1710. Appar-
ently their brother, William Tippet, d.s.p. and his aforementioned two
sisters inherited their father's land in Richmond County which fell into

- DONIPHAN, ALEXANDER [CAPTAIN, GENTLEMAN] (circa 1653-1717), widower, married (2)
by 2 November 1691 Margaret Mott, second daughter of George Mott, Gentleman,
of Rappahannock County, patentee of thousands of acres of land in the North-
ern Neck of Virginia. Margaret (Mott) Doniphan died prior to 23 March 1709.

DUNAWAY, THOMAS and Eleanor Woollard, bond 23 July 1789. John Woollard (b). Consent by Mary Ann Woollard, mother of the bride.

DUNAWAY, WILLIAM of Lancaster County and Fanny T. Davenport*, bond 7 September 1811. William H. Davenport (b); William Hathaway (w).

DUNCAN, COLEMAN married 17 March 1769 Mary Lyne (spinster), daughter of Thomas Lyne (1777-1765) and Mary _____ (1777-1785), his wife, both of whom died testate in Richmond County. Coleman Duncan was the son of Henry Duncan [Dunkin] who died testate in Richmond County in 1772 leaving his estate to several sons but failing to mention his son Coleman Duncan and confirm a verbal deed of gift of certain Negroes to him made at the time of his aforementioned marriage. The neglect of Henry Duncan to do this prompted Coleman Duncan to instigate the suit in chancery styled Duncan vs Duncan in which these facts are detailed. DUNCAN, HENRY and Charity Mitchell, bond 29 October 1766. Coleman Duncan (b). [This is the second marriage of Henry Duncan (1777-1772); see references above under his son by his first marriage, Coleman Duncan.]

DUNCAN, ROBERT married by 1715 Ann Gallup, one of the four daughters of Robert Gallup who died 20 May 1720 leaving a comprehensive will which takes full effect as to his landed estate. WB#3, p.60; King George County, Va., p.10.

DURNAM, THOMAS married 1682 Dorothy _____ (born circa 1664), probably a relative of William Smoot, Sr. (1677-1716) who, "for love and affection," deeded her land 2 August 1700 with reversion to her children Thomas, John, and Mary Durham. Thomas Durham (circa 1660-1714) died testate but before his last will was admitted to record his widow had married Jeremiah Greenleaf (q.v.). DURHAM, THOMAS JR. (27 June 1690-1 December 1734) was born and died in North Durham Parish; he was the eldest child of Thomas and Dorothy Durham (q.v.). He married circa 1710 Mary Smoot (7 April 1693-8 May 1750), daughter of William Smoot, Sr. (1677-1716) and Jane _____ (1677-1726), his wife. They had a large family. GREEN, RICHARD (167?-1705) married Ann Hobbs, only child of Richard Hobbs (1644-1683) and his wife nee Mary Meade, only child of Thomas Meade [Meade] who owned 700 acres of land in Rappahannock County in 1662 which fell into Richmond County in 1692. Ann (Hobbs) Green m(2) John Branham (q.v.), p.23, 1714 and died prior to 1734 when John Branham [Branham, Branhan &c:] was yet living. There are numerous records in regard to the landed estate of Ann (Hobbs) Green Branham but a deed dated 6 November 1752 (DB#11, p.155) indicates she then had only two living heirs, viz: her grandson Edward Spencer, Gentleman, (1710-1753) of Orange County and her great-granddaughter Ann the wife of John White, also of Orange County. GREENHAM, JEREMIAH and Dorothy Durham (widow), license February 1714/15.

[Dorothy Durham was the widow of Thomas Durham of North Farnham Parish; his will dated 4 August 1711 was proved 1 June 1715 after the marriage of his widow to Jeremiah Greenham (167?-1753). Jeremiah Greenham m(2) Mary [?] but died without issue; his will was proved in Richmond County, 1753. DB#7, p.63; WB#3, p.210, 270; WB#5, p.718; Stafford County DB "J", p.340-346.]

GREENLAW, DAVID of Westmoreland County and Alice B. Godfrey, bond 8 June 1811. William Settle (b). [David Greenlaw was the son of William and Mary (Oldham) Greenlaw (q.v.). In 1826 he became entangled with James V. Berrick, counterfeiter of bank notes, and in order to avoid prosecution absconded, leaving his wife Alice B. (Godfrey) Greenlaw with six infant children ranging in age from about 15 years to 1 year, viz: (1) John Oliver; (2) William Bowden; (3) Anders G; (4) Mary Agnes; (5) Lucy Ann; and (6) Donald Greenlaw. David Greenlaw was possessed of Islington on the Rappahannock River, about 20 slaves and other valuable personal property. There is considerable detail in many petitions to the Legislature 1828-1834. GREENLAW, WILLIAM SR. (177?-1811) of Westmoreland County married by 1778 Mary Oldham (177?-1825), daughter of William Oldham (1728-1777) and granddaughter of William and Priscilla (McLaughlin) Oldham (q.v.).
