Dear Sarah W. Arnette;  
From Vol. 9 - of the Dye books  
I noticed your articles and that you live  
in S.C.

I have worked on S.C. Dye lines for so long  
but seems like records are scarce. I have  
your George Dye's "will" and Rev. war  
record. I've tried for years to find out if  
he was a son of my George Dye born CA.,  
1735-40 in Richmond Co. - Va. The reason - is  
right before the Rev. war we had three brothers  
go to N.C. and one brother moved on to S.C.  
An old Civil war letter in N.C. verifies this  
tradition as Martin Evander Dye told the  
same story - even that he went to S.C. and  
met desc. of this brother. In all this  
the one to S.C. his name was not mentioned!

My Dyes were all over S.C.

John Dye left a will 1797 - Kershaw Co. S.C.  
I had Maples - Sissons - Newmans and  
allied families in S.C. too.  
LT. Jonathan Dye was killed in Rev. war in Va  
his family all moved to S.C. following  
the war.

My Randolph Dye went to Abbeville Co. S.C.  
from Elbert Co. Ga.

I won't make this too detailed - I just  
had many Dyes in S.C. I need info.  
on a Martin Dye in Greenville Co. S.C.  
he was in 1800 Census. I'd  
appreciate any Dye info; and will share mine.

near Spartanburg - there is a grave stone  
marked Matilda Dye  
born 1810 - VA.

wife of William Dye

In her memory by her son, JOHN

I have several listings but not all  
of them fit together.

I have Abraham Dye (mine we think)  
& wife Mary to S.C. before the Rev.  
had children;

Thomas John Mary

perhaps more -

Mary md. I LAND

There are records of her being a widow  
and her brother being named her child's  
guardian.

Pat Dye - The Coach at Auburn &  
his father was a 1<sup>st</sup> cousin of  
William Wheeler Dye of Ga. They  
are of my line - Pat Dye has a  
cousin Dr. David Goddard Dye of  
Greensboro, N.C. Pat's ancestors were  
also mine down to CA. 1757. His line  
moved from Va. - to N.C. - S.C. then GA.

Bradford Dye is <sup>now</sup> Lt. Gov. of MS.  
he is also of my Dyes - a different  
branch than Pat Dyes or mine.

Have you ever found the parents of your  
George Dye? As I recall he was very  
young to serve in the war. He traveled  
up and down the river on a patrol boat.

Perhaps we can help each other on Dye mysteries.  
I've heard the Lt. Jonathan Dye family  
tried to obtain a pension -

Don't ever try to get D.A.R. listing on him -  
I paid \$4.00 for it to learn the line  
has to be proven again. He died in the  
war but he didn't marry Nancy Green.  
There was a John Dye m.d. Nancy Green  
in Williamsburg - Va. and they had a  
son William Dye.

The census shows several Dyes in S.C.  
but several folks have tried to place them  
and can't. I have several Dye family  
lists - many moved on to other states.

Have you ever found a Nancy Elizabeth Dye  
m.d. to a James Dillard in Chester Co?  
Nancy Eliz. Dye born CA 1820.

Pardon writing - I have arthritis in my  
hands and have been writing too much  
this week.

Can you place a John and Henry Dye in  
Chester Co. <sup>born</sup> CA, 1770 - gone by 1791?
