CHILD NOTES: George Washington DYE

G.W. died from a stroke a few hours, after beings found by a negro hiredhand in his tobacco patch. Confederate; Voluntered with Arcadia Invincibles, these men were from Terryville community, and was part of Co.B Louisiana Infantry. He was promoted to Corporal Nov. 1863. Paroled at end of Civil War, 1865 at Greensboro, NC. G.W. carried a bullet in his shoulder received during the war until his death.

G.W. Dye went to Salem community, Claiborne Co.LA, Abt. 1853, with his then father-inlaw William H.Colvin. He was a Baptist, but went to Salem Methodist church with his wife and children.

June 1,1860 Agriculture report; 25 acres improved and 230 unimproyed. Cash value of farm\$1250. Value of farm implements \$5. Swine four, value of livestock\$ 16, Indian corn 200 bushels. [two] 400lbs. of ginned cotton bales, two lbs. bees wax, twenty-eight lbs of honey, value of animals slaughtered \$80, value of homemade manufactures \$10. Confederate; Pvt. Co.G., 33 Reg't Miss. Infantry, later became Co.G 45th Reg't Inf. listed 3/13/1862 Corinth MS. He was captured Thursday , Jan. 1, 1863 at the battle of Stone River, Murfreesboro TN. Campaign under Gen. Braxton Bragg. He was taken to Gratiot street Federal Prison, St. Louis, MO. and was released Feb. 13, 1863 by a prison exchange, he took the oath of Renunciation and Allegiance to the Union. Reinlisted in C.S. A June 16, 1863 at Ellistown, MS. Pvt. Co. E. 2nd Reg't Miss. State Cavalry until wars end.
