Info from Sarah Wylie Arnette(Mrs. Ed Mobley Arnette) Rt 4 Box 295-B Winnsboro, SC. 29180 sent to me in 1980--Early land grant records show Thomas Dye grant 1772 and John Dye grant 1772.

From the Chester Co., Gen Soc. Bulletin Vol XI Sept, 1983 no. 111--Elisha Dye was in Capt. Andrew Hemphill's Co., upper Bat. of Col. Richardson's Regmt., who marched from Home 7th Inst 1778 under the command of Major Joseph Brown and now in camp near Monk's Corner, Dec 21st 1778. Lists men and officers, issued gun and shot bag, no ammunition issued.

As of 1997, no record of Elisha's military record or any pension records have been found.

It is thought by some that Elisha Dye might have come from VA.

In Elisha Dye's will he mentions his wife but does not name her. He leaves all his possessions to ch: sons, Weldon, Lewis, Thomas and James, to his daughters Wilmoth and Elizabeth. His son Phillip is dead, and he leaves Phillip's share of his estate to Phillip's widow Sophia. He also leaves a share to his three grandchildren, John Lott, Elisha Lott and Patsy Sandifer Lott.

There has been speculation that Elisha also had a daughter Willey. If you read his will, he leaves slaves Nance, Rose, Dinah, Nathan, Devvy, and Peter to Daughter Wilmoth. When she signs the papers as receiving her inheritance, she signs with her mark and her name is written as Willey, however she signs that she has received slaves Nance, Rose, Dinah, Nathan, Devvy, and Peter. This is proof that Wilmoth and Willey are one and the same, and that Wilmoth was called Willey.

Note the following:

Indenture made 3 September 1783 between Elisha Dye and Richard Dye of Sumpter Co., SC., planter of the one part and Robert Jamison, of the County and state aforesaid of the other part, planter. By a certain grant dated 7 April, 1770, by William Bull, Governor of Province of S. C. to give to Abram Dye now deceased three hundred acres of land situated and lying on Bull Skin Run waters of Rockey Creek (N.B. This would be in present Chester County but deed reads Sumpter Co.--J.A.) The plat is recorded in the Secretaries Office of S. C. in Book

E.E.E. page 230. This Indenture witnesseth that Elisha Dye and Richard Dye for two hundred and twenty five pounds of lawful money of the state paid by Robert Jamison do sell in his actual possession for one whole year one hundred and fifty acres of Colonel Land-North by lands of Adam Eager--East by lands of Widow Harbinson and South by lands of Archibald Henderson--

In the 1850 census Phillip is dead and wife Sophia is with Lewis and Weldon.

Elisha is listed in 1790 and 1820 census in Chester Co. In 1810 Lewis, Phillip, and Thomas are listed but only Lewis appears in Chester Co. in 1830.

In 1850 James, Thomas, Lacy and Shelby are in Carroll Co. Ms. The Dye's that left SC migrated to Calhoun Co., Miss. There are many descendants of Elisha Dye living there today.

From information received by me, from the Fairfield County Museum, Winnsboro, S.C. in 1983, some people think Lucy Thorn was the wife of Elisha Dve. From the

records I have found, this is not true. In Chester County Marriages Implied in Equity Records 1778-1879 you will find James Dye mar Lucy Thorn. this record can be found in papers: Bill # 209 frame 283. This will clarify that information.

The following is from Chester Co., S.C. Court Records;

262 An Indenture of Lease and Release from Elisha Dye and Rebecca his wife to Robert Jamison was proved by the oath of James Hannah and William McCullah Witnesses thereto and Ordered to be recorded.

This proves Rebecca was the wife of Elisha Dye of Chester Co., SC.
