

NOTE:It is believed this 'William' is the one known as the 'gentleman Justice of Stafford County' and who was married to Betty Helm or Helms whose father was a member of the House of Burgesses. He was one of the three sons of Christopher Edrington (1672-1738).

NOTE: Note from a letter from Clair Utt of Winfield, KS., dated April 1994:
"From CALENDAR OF VIRGINIA STATE PAPERS, by Palmer: List of Justices of
Stafford Co. that have taken oaths and those that have refused (among others
appear names Edrington). Also from Claire, via Bill Cheatham of Crofton, MD:
The Register of Overwharton Parish of Stafford C., VA, 1723-1758,pg 31, #6:
"Negro Slaveholders in Overwharton Parish, WILLIAM EDRINGTON had a slave born
or baptized first in 1745."

NOTE:See also the chapter on the 'Ederington Family' in THE HISTORY OF FAIRFIELD COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA, by William Ederington.

WIFE - Elizabeth 'Betty' HELM-213

NOTE:Betty's name might be HELM, HELMES, or HELMS. Letter from Golda dated 7 Oct 1991 has figured her age at about 18 years old at the time of marriage to William (b 1712)...maybe 16. That would put her birth in the 1720-1722 era.

From a letter from Bill Edrington in Tennessee, dated 22 August 1991: "Old William E., the J.P. of Stafford Co ca 1715-20 --- ca 1769-70, son of Christopher II, md. Betty Helm (obligated to be a sister of old Lynaugh Helm). Also old William's sister, Hester md. said Helm, so we have a double connection of sorts."

CHILDREN:SLC LDS GEN LIB has FS#032998, which has the birthdates of 5 of the William/Betty children listed on the Overwharton Episcopal Parish Record.

NOTE: [See data on land deal with Elizabeth, Mary, Henry, and James Davis, copied in "NOTES" under name of MARY (EDRINGTON) DAVIS). RIN # 120 [PAF data of LKE].

CHILD 1 - William EDRINGTON-117

NOTES: Married: Jemima Smith Porter who died in 1815-17. Children: William, Henry, John, George, Fanny. (May be more...these were mentioned in the settlement of the estate).

On 22 Sept 1991 the following information was obtained from microfilm copies at the BYU Family History Dept of the school library. [Film #0292439, Files and Packages--1817-1835, file 3, pkg 79, Court of Probate, dated 20 Nov 1794, entitled "Conditions of sale of the personal estate of William Edrington, dec."

"On 3d of Oct 1794 Jamima Ederington appeared before the court and took an oath to administer the estate of her deceased husband, William Ederington..."

ENOTE: She signed her name...didn't make a mark. There are several official

papers in the packet revolving around the liquidation of the estate of the late husband of Jamima. Jamima, James Davis, and Henry Edrington to act as a group to inventory and appraise the estate. The name Jemima/Jamima is used alternately. "Henry" was probably the second son of William and Jamima; James Davis was probably the James Davis who married Anne, William's sister, and who died just before January 1824.]

The three people took the inventory and appraisal on 12 Oct 1794. There was then a public sale held on 24 Nov 1794. [NOTE: South Carolina had abolished the Right of Primogeniture in 1791 and an equal distribution of intestates' estates granted.]

The estate was divided between the five (5) children and the mother in an agreed fashion (Jamima---William, George, Henry, Fanny, and John). Also included were a James Talbert and a Daniel Mayberry, and it was noted that THOMAS got the old hoes and axes. [It can probaby be assumed that THOMAS (b. 17 Aug 1743) was the younger brother of William...who passed away only three (3) years later, in 1797.] The estate was an ample one, with no slaves mentioned.

NOTE: Ancestral File shows Jemima Smith, b 1736 m. Edrington. Contributor:
Robert Dean Lawrence, 4508 S Oak, Wichita, KS, 67217. AF also shows a
birthdate for Edrington as 1736. There is other information that states
that his birth was in 1741. If William, Sr was born abt 1712...then it
is a time element that would fit for either 1736 or 1741.

NOTE:Reese June & Carrington have found an old hand-written chart in their files (Oct 1994) which is quite a valuabe additional piece of information for current Edrington researchers. They do not know just where they picked it up. I have had much of its' contents in my data-base...but much is new to me. I will refer to it as the "Carrington Mystery Document"...and assisn it the acronym CMD in my notes.

MOTE: The CMD has a date of birth of William, Jr, as being 1739, King George County, Virginia, and accredited 2 (two) wives: 1: UNKNOWN, and 2: JEMIMA PORTER followed by a (?). My own research had located only JEMIMA.

NOTE:It is believed that this 'William Edrington' is the "Gentleman Justice of Stafford County". [K-note:The CMD is known now to have originated with Bill Edrington of Memphis. (1995).]

NOTE:Will & Deed Book Q, p 239, William and Jemima sold 171 acres in Overwarten Parish, Virginia. And William and Jemima sold 112 acres to Benj Willet at Overwharton Parish in 1782. Other land sale before in 1781.

BIR: Harry B Zabriskie of Salt Lake City is a descendent of Roxanna (Ann) Kendall through his mother's side of the family. Info regarding the birth of this individual was given to me over the telephone on 13 June 1992. The birthdate was 6 Dec 1745, as recorded on p 121 of the Overwharton Parish register. Thomas was listed on p 107 of the same record. Roxanna (Ann) was a sister to Samuel Kendall.

NOTE: There are two wives listed in this data for THOMAS EDRINGTON. (1)Rosannah Grant R=1967, and (2)Roxann or 'Ann' Kendall R=2336. Further clarification is needed if he had two wives.[sub-note: According to the STARR PAPERS, there is an entry that states that the marriage to Rosanna (?) Grant was not a good one and they parted soon after marriage..."she appears later as being alone." (Louisa Co., Va, Census of 1782-1785, Hundred 3).

NOTE:On page 263-264 of the Records of Stafford County, Virginia, there is an "Act of Agreement" dated 14 of May 1785, between THOMAS EDRINGTON and his wife, ROSANNA GRANT EDRINGTON, agreeing that '...by mutual consent' have '...finally parted'. The document reads as follows: "To all people .. I THOMAS EDRINGTON of County of Stafford in considerations of sundry disagreements, and other causes, between said Thomas Edrington and ROSANNAH his Wife, in consequence of which they have by mutual consent finally parted, and whereas Rosannah at her Marriage with Thomas was possessed with six Slaves from which numbers have since proceeded, therefore as Thomas is hereafter to be at no expence on account of said Rosanah (except maintaining her and her children from the date hereof till new years day next ensuing) after which time, she is to have all her children, and the six following Slaves (named), which Slaves together with their increase after the decease of her - Rosanah shall be equally divided among her children legally begotten. Furthermore Thomas doth hereby bind himself .. to quit all claim to said Slaves .. shall by no means of any kind of force or compulsion in order to bring his wife to dwell or cohabit with him at any time hereafter, neither shall he nor Rosanah his wife have powers to dispose of the six slaves.. this 14th May 1785. Presence of SAMUEL FANT, JOHN STERN, JOHN FANT, BENJAMIN FICKLEN.

ISLC Gen Lib FS# 33946 has copy of this Act of Separation Agreement].

ESTATE: In Nov of 1994 Clair Utt visited in Columbia, S.C. and sent me a photostat copy of the estate papers of Thomas Ederington. Letter dealing with the appointment of an administrator was enclosed. It follows:

Fairfield County: By the honorable Judges of the County Court of Fairfield---"Whereas JOHN MEANS hath applied to us for Letters of Administration in all and singular the goods and Chattles, rights and Credits of THOMAS EDERINGTON at of the said county, deceased---

These are therefore to cite and adminstrate all and singular the kindred and creditors of the said deceased to be and appear before us at a Court to be hold in and for Fairfield County at Winnsboro on the 16th day of April next, to 9 Jul 1997 Page 6 of 15

shew cause if any he have why the said Administration should not be granted.

Given under my hand this 19th day of January 1797."

NOTE: The following item is taken from the FAIRFIELD COUNTY DEED BOOK 'A' - 1785-1794, pages 178-180 and reproduced in "The South Carolina Magazine of Ancestral Research, Vol XVI, Number 3, Summer 1988, pages 168-169. Sent to me in Nov 1994 by Clair Utt:

"THOMAS EDERINGTON to ARRAMANOS LILES, both of Fairfield Co., Camden Dist., bond for 46 pds. 13 shillings 4 pence sterling to be paid in specie. Bond dated 11 Jan 1793. Condition being that said THOMAS EDERINGTON hath received of said ARRAM. LILES 213 pds. 6 shillings 8 pence for which Ederington delivers to Liles one Negro man named Will about 25 years of age, to work for the sum of 23-6-8 until 12 Dec. 1793. If money not paid in that length of time, Liles to Give Ederington till 25 Dec 1794. Should the said Negro die the loss to be Ederington's. If debt paid, above obligation null and void. Wits: CHRISTOPHER EDERINGTON, SAMUEL FANT and WILLIAM EDERINGTON. Proved by CHRISTR. EDERINGTON 4 Feb 1793 before S. W. Yongue, J.P. Recorded 27 Feb. 1793."

NOTE: In the "General Index of Deeds, Deeds of Trusts, Release Deeds and Wills - Stafford, County, Virginia, Chronologically Arranged", under the EDRINGTON surname listing: A Land Deed from THOMAS EDRINGTON to JOHN KENDALL, found in Book S, page 139, Sept 12 1785 ('B and S'). [K-note: This researcher has not investigated the above source, but it is interesting to note that after separating (later divorce) from Rosanne GRANT on May 14 1785, he is involved with a land deal with a John KENDALL 4 months later. We find, also, that THOMAS later marries a ROXANN KENDALL...who is with him, after 1792, in Fairfield, South Carolina. One wonders what the relationship is between JOHN and ROXANN KENDALL: Bro/sis? Father/dau? or some other. Needs to be researched further.

NOTE: The following is some information from SLC Film Strip # 33957, taken 6 years ago. It is titled "Tax List for 1773-95" (presumably for Stafford County):

NOTE: He lived for awhile down in

Aft Jun 1785 Roxann KENDALL-2336

South Carolina and had a large family. The census of 1790 shows a family of 10. But he left So. Carolina before the 1800 Census. We don't know where he went, but he may have gone back to Virginia. I haven't run across him in Kentucky. Again, he may have gone into Mississippi or Tennessee, but haven't run into him there, either.

NOTE: Christopher fought in the Revolutionary War. According to the HISTORICAL REGISTER OF VIRGINIANS IN THE REVOLUTION he was assigned to Captain John Martin's Company, Westmoreland Militia, and was appointed a 2nd Lt on August 26 1777 and then appointed a 1st Lt on May 26 1778. Further, William Ederington, when writing his HISTORY OF FAIRFIELD COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA tells that all his uncles (brothers of his grandfather, Francis) served in the war, which would include CHRISTOPHER.

Christopher's second wife was JEMIMA PORTER SMITH. He was her second husband. They had no children. [K-note: Could he, indeed, have married the widow of his brother, THOMAS? The statement doesn't 'jibe' with the other data. I have no idea where I might have picked this statement up].

NOTE: Ancestral File shows his first wife as JANE PRICE. Needs to be verified.

[Note added on 31 March 1992.]

SUB: Sarah Leavitt, 5310-52 Ave., Wetaskiwin, AL, CANADA T9A-DX7. [AF# 1394273. Sub: AF83-062919]. Sarah Leavitt was the submitter to the Ancestral File that contained the listing of a 'JANE PRICE' as the wife of CHRISTOPHER EDRINGTON. I wrote her a letter at the above address...but the letter was returned because she no longer lived at that address and left no forwarding information.

MIL: VIRGINIA COUNTY RECORD PUBLICATIONS, 1962, Balt. Gen. Publ. Co., Vol I Westmoreland wills, etc., p 85: An order to establish a company of Militia. Note: Court order issued on 25 March 1777. John Richards to be the Captain. Second Court Order on 26 Aug 1777. CHRISTOPHER EDRINGTON, appointed as Lt to Captain Jacob Martin's Company.

NOTE: The following information was taken from the BULLETIN, Sept 1990, Vol VIII, Number III, Chester District Genealogical Society, serving Chester, (SC) Fairfield, Lancaster, Union and York Counties. PC Box 336, Richburg, SC 29749, pp 82-88 and continuing "1792 Tax list, Fairfield County, State Tax", p 85:

"HENRY EDRINGTON had 3 slaves, CHRISTOPHER had 2 and THOMAS had 1."

IK-note: There were no other 'Ederingtons' listed. It could be noted that the 'Edringtons' were known as 'EDERINGTONS' in South Carolina...but the surname interchangeability can be noted by the above reference to HENRY 'EDRINGTON'].

CHILD 4 - Mary Ann (Mollie) EDRINGTON-120

NOTE:Mary Anne went to So. Carolina with her mother just before the Rev. War. Her mother married a John Davis...and Anne married his son, James. [See further material under James' name].

NOTE: According to the data bank of William Scroggins of Taylor Mill, KY, Mary was married to a ______ Furrey. This may have been a second husband.

NOTE:At this writing (Oct 1994) there is a little confusion as to the exact status/name of this child. She is listed in the OPR as "Anne", but in South Carolina she seems to be known as 'Mary'...with the nickname of 'Mollie'. Her full name, at birth, may well have been 'Mary Anne Edrington'...which would account for her being called 'Mollie'. In his book HISTORY OF FAIRFIELD COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA, William Ederington speaks of her indirectly when telling of her marriage to JAMES DAVIS in this fashion: "...and her (Betty's) oldest daughter married his son, James Davis." ANNE, according to the OPR (Overwharton Parish Register) would be the oldest child.

Further on in William Ederington's book, in a chapter entitled "Various Fairfield Families", p 62, he would seem to be giving some additional evidence

for the above conclusion regarding her name when he says: "Colonel JONATHAN DAVIS was a son of JAMES DAVIS, who came from York County a short time after the Revolutionary War, and married Miss MOLLIE EDERINGTON." Another item might be mentioned here. Mary Ann's younger brother, FRANCIS (b-1764) named a daughter 'Mary Ann'...perhaps after her aunt.

'DEATH:Mary Anne's date of death, according to 'Bill of TN', is hard to determine from the copy I have. It appears to be in the 1840s. As near as I can make it out, it would be: Before Dec 7 1840. Her husband died in 1822.

NOTE: The following is from FAIRFIELD COUNTY, S.C. DEED BOOK S, page 242, (from microfilm on loan from library at Winnsboro, S.C.), typed by Claire Utt, 1518 E 12th St., Winfield, KS., June, 1995; sent to LKE Feb 1996.

"() Presents do grant bargain and sell and release unto the said HENRY EDRINGTON, planter, all that plantation or tract of land containing 120 acres, more or less, being part of a tract of 300 acres originally granted to John Dye, situate on the north side of Broad River and on the waters of Turkey Creek, conveyed from him to ELIZABETH EDRINGTON by heirship, then conveyed from him to JAMES DAVIS -

---Beginning on SAMUAL FANT's line within 16 ft and a half of JAMES ROBUCKs, comes thence North on said FANT's land to a tract oak, thence NE on said EDRINGTON's land to a pine South East on GEORGE SMITH's to a pine, thence continuing said course in said DAVIS land to a stake, thence SW on said DAVIS land a hickory on a branch, down said land branch with the meanders to a large oak, continuing near the said branch to within 16 ft & of JAMES ROBUCK's line to the beginning,

together with all and singular the rights, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises, belonging, or in any way incident or appertaining, to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentionedunto the said HENRY EDRINGTON, his heirs and assigns forever and do hereby bind myself, my heirs, Executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said HENRY EDRINGTON, his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs and against every person lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.

Witness my hand and seal this 25th day of January in the year of our Lord 1797 and in the 21st year of the Independence of America.

CHILD 5 - John E EDRINGTON-569

NOTE: The following data concerning JOHN EDRINGTON was taken from a letter from Golda Brothers Edrington, dated 7 October 1991.

"John ETHRINGTON, sometimes spelled EDENTON, but in later years was spelled EDRINGTON by the children and grandchildren enlisted in Rev. War in Spottsylvania Co, Va in October 1777. He drew pay until July 1781, was a prisoner at Charleston S.C. (wonder if he knew he had 'kin' so close?) He returned home to Va and married Jan or Feb 1781 at Culpeper Co. Va: Susan Sukkey. The only sure date for this man was in the pension application dated April 16, 1818 at which time he was about '66' years old. His wife was about 11 years younger than him (in one paper he said he was 68 and she was 57. She was 77 in 1841 when she applied for a widow pension. John died 31 Dec 1830. She died sometime after 1841."

From a packet of materials received 23 July 1991, concerning this John Edrington. From: Charles David Edrington of Leesburg, Ohio, Weseleyan minister.

NOTE: There is a mention of a JOHN EDRINGTON [Ederington?] in a book entitled HISTORY OF FAIRFIELD COUNTY SOUTH CAROLINA: FROM BEFORE THE WHITE MAN CAME TO 1942, by FitzHugh McMaster, the Reprint Company, Publ, Spartanburg, SC, 1980, page 120: "JOHN EDRINGTON listed as one of the members of a payroll in the company of Capt John Buchanan, 6th So Carolina, or the Continental Establishment commanded by Lt Col William Hendersen...from the 1st of August to the 1st of Dec 1779." [note: It would seem that this 'John' is not the one listed here].

MARR: According to material in the W T Cheatham Update of July 1994 "He married his sister-in-laws' (Caty Etherington?) sister, Susan Suckey (?). She resided in Highland Co, Va., 1841. (Children were listed in the pension

CHILD 7 - James EDRINGTON-122

NOTE: His birthdate is recorded in the remnants of THE REGISTER OF OVERWHARTON PARISH, 1720-1760, Book 975.526, Vol. 26k. What became of James (1756) is unknown at this time. There are some researchers who believe that he is the 'other' James (1742-1847), who was purported to die at 105 yrs of age at Trigg County, Kentucky. My own opinion, at this moment, is that they are two separate individuals...cousins. That opinion is based on the evidence that the older James most probably did have a separate existence from the year 1742. I see no need to suggest that they are one and the same person.

CHILD 8 - Francis EDRINGTON-123

NOTE: Francis married Frances Crosswhite, b. 1767, d. Apr 1829. (age: 62) Children: Jesse, Francis, John, William, Mildred, Elizabeth, Sallie/Sarah IThese children are identified through the Federal Census reports and through the writings in the book HISTORY OF FAIRFIELD COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA by William Ederington...(one of the above children, who never married)...and through the surviving public records of the 1790 to 1850 period. These are noted when applicable].

On 22 Sept 1991 this researcher ran across the Will of Francis Edrington. It is located on SLC Filmstrip #0024008 (LDS Family History Library), and has the notation at the end of it that states that it was written on 10 June 1824 and proved (but not found). It was recorded on 4 Nov 1824 in Willbook #8, p 6, apt #46, file #720.

DEATH: According to a letter from Clair Utt of Winfield, Kansas, the minutes of the New Buffalo Baptist Church lists FRANCIS EDRINGTON as dying in 1829, age: 61 yrs, b in Culpeper Co., Va....[might be wrong county.]

WILL: WILL OF FRANCIS EDRINGTON, SR.

"Whereas I Francis Edrington Sr of Fairfield Dist; So. Carolina, planter, being weak in body, but of a sound mind and memory, calling to remembrance that it is appointed for man once to die; do make and bequeath this my last will and testament, revoking all other wills and testaments whatever. In the first place it is my will that my body be decently buried, after the most Christian burial; and that my funeral expenses be paid—and that all my lawful debts be paid. In second place, it is my will and pleasure, that my beloved son, William should have the whole of the land, or my permanent place of residence on Beaver Creek—to have his choice of two negros, to wit Giles or Lewis—I also will and bequeath my son William, one bed and furniture—2 cows and calves—It is also my will and pleasure that the balance of the stock and household furniture—and plantation utensils be sold at public auction and the proceeds of the sale to be divided, share and share alike.

"Item, it is my will and pleasure, that my beloved daughter, Mildred Fant---consort of William Fant---should retain, according to a former deed or gift, which I wish to remain valid, the three negros which she has now in her

possession and that after my son William should make his choice of the 2 negros Giles or Lewis, that my daughter Mildred, is to have one of them; but she is not to share in any of the proceeds of sales of stock, utensils, household furniture, and whatever. Item. It is my wish and pleasure that all the remaining negros, those exempted of course agreeable to the intention of this instrument of writing, to wit the 3 in possession of my daughter Mildred Fant, and the proceeds to be equally distributed among all my other children--Mildred and William excepted.

"Item. It is my will and pleasure that all monies that I have in possession, and arising from notes and accounts, as well as from my present growing crop, should be equally divided between all my children, without exception. It is my will and pleasure, that the note I have against my son William, of fifty dollars, in consideration of a horse purchased of me, shall not be demanded—but to remain of no form null and void. Item. I do hereby appoint my beloved sons, Jesse, Francis, and William, to be executors of this my last will and testament."

Subscribed to this 10th of June A.D. 1824, In the presence of

COMMENTS:

Four of the children are mentioned in the Will: Mildred, William, Jesse, and Francis. Of these, William later said "My oldest sister, Mildred, married William Fant in 1817, and moved to Union County in 1821. He died in 1854, she afterwards lived in Fairfield with her son Dr. F.H. Fant, and died there in 18_, at the advanced age of 91". If that be true, then she must have been born around the year 1800 or before and died in the 1835-1891 time-frame. [Her age would make her one of three 'old' Edringtons that I know of so far: James (1742-1847)--who was 105, his grandaughter, Lydia...who was 93...and now Mildred at 91.1

William (the author) says of himself "I was born at my father's old homestead on Rock Creek, in Fairfield County, S.C., February 10, 1803..." and then proceeds to tell a little more of his life. The rest of the story can be found in his book. William was an educated, highly respected individual. He never married.

Francis Jr also was a bachelor.

Jesse married Elizabeth Webb and had children who have descended down to the present day. [Note: Tom Edrington of Albuquerque, N.M.]

Further information on these four children can be obtained from other records, including the Data Base of this researcher.

But whatever happened to the other children...those not mentioned in the Will?

According to William (the author) "My brother, John, moved to Kentucky about 1815 and married and died there".

"My second sister, Elizabeth, married William Vance, of Laurens County, in 1821...He died about 1827, leaving nine children, quite a charge for my sister...she moved to Mississippi about the year 1857 and died there a few years afterwards..."

"My third sister, Sallie, married David Vance, and lived near Milton, Laurens County, and died there in 1832.

Thus, one could reconstruct some basic chronological data for the seven children as follows:

It is likely that Elizabeth and Sallie married brothers from Laurens County. (William and David Vance). [Laurens County joins Newberry Co. on the south and Fairfield Co. joins it on the north.] The town where they lived was called Marion.

The following additional information concerning the girls is found in a publication called FAIRFIELD COUNTY MARRIAGES, 1775 - 1879, Implied in Fairfield County, S.C. Probate Records, by Barbara R. Langdon, p 160-161.

are WILLIAM and DAVID (as per HISTORY OF FAIRFIELD COUNTY, S.C.) The 1824 date of 'implication' comes from the recording of Francis' will in November of that year. Though Elizabeth and Sarah (Sallie) are not mentioned specifically in the will, there is probably further discussion concerning them in the packets and files of this particular action of the probate court. This researcher has the necessary packet titles and descriptions if anyone would like to pursue further inquiry. Those packets, containing the various APT, FILE, and FRAME numbers, are all on micro-film and a copy is at SLC.

There is a publication called FAIRFIELD COUNTY SOUTH CAROLINA MINUTES OF THE COUNTY COURT, 1785-1799, by Brent H. Holcomb, C.A.L.S., and in it there are the following references to Francis Edrington:

First session: 1786 James Gray vs Fra. Ederington Issue Joined. Second ": 1786 Richard Winn vs Fras. Edrington Default

Francis was too young to join the Revolutionary War Effort at first but he later enlisted at the age of 16 and served as a Quartermaster under Lafayette. The DAR PATRIOTIC INDEX, p. 215, lists his birth and death dates and says he was a "Pvt, QM, S.C." and married to Frances Crosswhite. In the book SCUTH CAROLINIANS IN THE REVOLUTION by Sara Sullivan Ervin, 1965, it says that he wrote EDERINGTON'S RECOLLECTIONS, 1780. Whether this was a book or an article is not known and no copies of it have come to light so far. Further comment on his military service is found in THE HISTORY OF FAIRFIELD COUNTY by William Ederington:

"My paternal uncles were all engaged in the Revolutionary War. My father being the youngest, did not engage in it until near its close. I heard him say that he volunteered at the age of sixteen under Captain Charnal Durham and encamped at Four Holes for some time awaiting orders, but soon after Henry Clinton evacuated Charleston, and the Corps was disbanded, and the soldiers all left for their homes and were nearly starved before they reached their destination, being afraid to call at any house or allow themselves to be seen, the country through which they had to pass being infested with Tories. Peace was soon after declared."

!NOTE: More can be learned about his war service from his Army records and/or by tracing the Company war history through the name of Captain Charnal Durham and the encampment at Four Holes. The ENCYCLOPEDIC HISTORY OF

NOTE: According to the data bank of William Scroggins of Taylor Mill, KY, Mary was married to a _____ Furrey. This may have been a second husband.

NOTE: At this writing (Oct 1994) there is a little confusion as to the exact status/name of this child. She is listed in the OPR as "Anne", but in South Carolina she seems to be known as 'Mary'...with the nickname of 'Mollie'. Her full name, at birth, may well have been 'Mary Anne Edrington'...which would account for her being called 'Mollie'. In his book HISTORY OF FAIRFIELD COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA, William Ederington speaks of her indirectly when telling of her marriage to JAMES DAVIS in this fashion: "...and her (Betty's) oldest daughter married his son, James Davis." ANNE, according to the OPR (Overwharton Parish Register) would be the oldest child.

Further on in William Ederington's book, in a chapter entitled "Various Fairfield Families", p 62, he would seem to be giving some additional evidence for the above conclusion regarding her name when he says: "Colonel JONATHAN DAVIS was a son of JAMES DAVIS, who came from York County a short time after the Revolutionary War. and married Miss MOLLIE EDERINGTON." Another item might be mentioned here. Mary Ann's younger brother, FRANCIS (b-1764) named a daughter 'Mary Ann'....perhaps after her aunt.

!DEATH:Mary Anne's date of death, according to 'Bill of TN', is hard to determine from the copy I have. It appears to be in the 1840s. As near as I can make it out, it would be: Before Dec 7 1840. Her husband died in 1822.
