seventh and ^{youngest} last child of
Thomas Ketchin Elliott

born December 7, 1893
in Winesboro, S.C.

His most recently deceased
sibling was Nell Elliott McMaster
(Mrs. Kitt Rion McMaster, Sr.)

He was a graduate of Mount Zion
Institute and Davidson College
where he was the valedictorian
of his class.

During the First World War
he served as a volunteer in
the Field Artillery and was
assigned to Battery E. 318th F.A.
81st Division.

He was promoted from Cadet
to captain, serving in France ^(Aug. 8, 1918 - July 29, 1919)
after his training enlistment
at Fort Oglethorpe, Georgia
May 14, 1917.

He was a wholesale distributor in Fairfield County and was affectionately called "The Candy Man". A voracious reader and dedicated Christian he was recognized as an excellent Sunday School teacher at Zion Presbyterian Church in Winnsboro where he was a member.

He was married to Ruth Guice.
He died November 5th, 1976.
