

We come across this bit of information. It might fit into your records somewhere.

William M^cCreery (1745-1838) was the first of his name in Fairfield. He came in 1790 having previously married in Ireland Margaret Adger 1747-1805. They brought three minor children with them, John, who married Molly Peggy Turner; James who married Jane Crawford and Susan who married William Adger.

Susan and William had a number of children some lived in Fairfield, some in Charlton. The Smyth family of Charlton are descendants.

James M^cCreery, son of John + Molly Peggy married Sarah Sunday Thorne and lived to be nearly 92 years of age, was one of the most highly respected men of his day. It is told of his great grandfather, Adger of Ireland, who owned a linen mill, that his stamp on a ball of linen caused acceptance without measurement. Capt Ellison A Smyth of Flat Rock, N.C. has that stamp.
