Ellis, Robert S26084
b. 1759/1760 Buckingham County, Va.
After entering service during the fall of 1780
in Abbeville District under Lt. William Cona-
way and Capt. John Lindsay, he was sent a-
gainst the Indians. He was in the engagement
on the Genestrose River and was wounded in
the heel. He was the only white man who was
hurt. After returning home, he was unable to
serve for two or three months. Next, he was
with Capt. Joseph Pickens and Col. McCall and
was in the battle at Cowpens. This tour lasted
two months. He was next under Capt. John
Wilson and was at the siege of Ninety Six. In
this siege his former captain, Joseph Pickens,
was killed. He was discharged by Gen. Andrew
Pickens. A short time thereafter, he entered
service under Capt. Moses Liddell and was in
the battle at Eutaw Springs. He left the battle-
field under a Capt. Frost to assist the wounded.
He served nine weeks on this tour.
