II Thomas Howell Jones, (unmarried) Anna Remond Ellisen, b. Nov. 30, 1828; m. May 15, 1850, by Rev P. Edwards, Col. S.H. Wilds of of Darlington, S.C., colonel of the militia before the war. He went into the Confederate Service ever age and was captain of Co. B 21 st Regiment S.C. Volunteers; refused promotion as colonel when the regiment was formed, to "remain with the boys"; was afterwards promoted over his protests to major, commanding his regiment most of the time in Va. He was three times wounded, taken prisoner and held at the old Capitol prison in Washington, and then at Ft. Delaware, till Jan. 25, 1865, at the close of t of the war. He died from the effects of exposure and wounds, Oct. 29, 1869.
