Pop we love you!

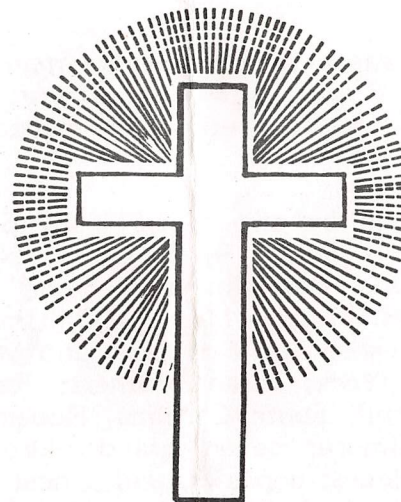
