The first Ellison of whom the oldest members of the famil have any knowledge was Robert Ellison, Esq., of Hepburn County, Eng., about 1690.

In 1700, he married Elizabeth Liddell, daughter of Henry Liddell, 3rd Baronet and Lord of Ravensworth, from Collins Peerage. Robert Ellison had a son William, who had two sons, who lived to come to maturity -- Capt. John and Major Robert Ellison.

Some of the family of Maj. Robert Ellison moved to Georgia. He has many descendants, among them Rev. William Boggs, Mrs. Fartin, or Georgia, Capt. Ellison A. Smythe end others. The Ellisons were originally English. They were titles Lairds and were landed proprietors with considerable property in the days of Wm. the Conqueror.
