John Winn Evans was born 15 June 1823 in Fairfield County. He was the son of Joseph and Elizabeth Harris Evans - one of nine children.

On 26 Jan 1847 he married Mary Gladney Martin, daughter of Cynes M<sup>r</sup> Ouzat Gladney and James D. Martin. She was born 14 Feb. 1824.

He farmed in the Monticello community of Fairfield County and ~~raised his family in~~ John Winn and Mary Evans became members of Salem Presbyterian Church on 21 Oct. 1866. He was elected elder on 8 Sept. 1872.

They reared four daughters, having lost 2 sons in early ~~childhood~~ <sup>widely in</sup> childhood. Their eldest son was Butler who was born about 1850

(listed in 1850 census at 4 mos. old) James Martin was born 1851 & 1859 boys, and buried at Lebanon Cemetery. Their second child was Elizabeth who married William M<sup>r</sup> Hill and moved to Palestine, Texas.

She died 1 Aug 1914 and is buried at Evans Chapel, Leon County, Texas. They had 2 sons - 1 daughter, had unmarried

Mary Caroline was born 29 Oct. 1855; was married on 17 Feb. 1874 <sup>by Rev. W. W. Mills</sup> to Dr. Robert Coleman Arnette, son of Robert ~~Fitz~~ John Zeeu Arnette and Eliza Coleman ~~she~~ died 7 June 1911 and is buried at Salem Presby Ch<sup>urch</sup>

Frances Lola was born c. 1860, married c. 1876 to Andrew Muir Wallace, son of Dr. John Wallace and Rebecca Elizabeth Witherspoon. She died c. 1937. They reared 2 daughters. "Ola" was baptized at Salem Presb. Ch. on 22 May 1875.

Minnie Lee was born c. 1865, married Wm. Julian Elliott, son of Henry Laurens Elliott and Margaret Ann Black. She was baptized at Salem Presby Ch. 19 May 1883 & died c. 1923. They reared 2 sons and 2 daughters.

Robert Coleman Arnette was born 27 July 1847 in <sup>Fairfield</sup> (His name was recorded in his father's will as <sup>County</sup> Robert Samuel. At sometime in <sup>his</sup> early ~~childhood~~ <sup>years</sup> youth, he changed his name and began the spelling of the surname with the addition of the e ending -) When he was about 5 yrs. old ~~his~~ <sup>his</sup> parents with <sup>children</sup> four ~~children~~ moved to Lincoln County Ga. (sometime ~~between~~ after 1855 Nov. 1855). His father died there in August 1856 and his widow <sup>returned</sup> ~~came back~~ to Fairfield County with her children.
