

Col. Feaster inducted into Citadel Athletic Hall of Fame

Fairfield County native Col. Ken Feaster was inducted into The Citadel's Athletic Hall of Fame during ceremonies on Saturday Nov. 10,

Feaster, Class of 1975, lettered four years on Chal Port-coached baseball teams, and was the first African-American baseball player in school history.

Earning all-Southern Conference recognition three times - twice at second base and once at shortstop - Feaster captained the '75 team that won the Southern Conference championship.

He held the school single-season and career stolen base records and was among the top 15 nationally in stolen base percentage.

A dean's list student, Feaster also earned all-district and all-state recognition and led the 1974 team in seven offensive categories and the '75 team in five categories.

Feaster is the first African-American Citadel alumni to earn the rank of colonel.

Feaster is a 1971 graduate of McCrorey-Liston High School in Blair. He is currently serving as the base Inspector General (IG) at Hill Air Force Base in Utah.
