From Margaret Narcissa Feaster's diary . Margaret Narcissa Feaster was the youngest of 11 children of Andrew Feaster and wife Mary Norris . Margaret was born on 15 Sept. 1839 . Her oldest brother was born 20 years earlier . The diary was started on 18 July 1860 .

" A.C. Feaster; brother of Laurence Feaster, of the Dark Corner". note # 146.

" Laurence Feaster " note 93 related to the Feaster family , born in Edgefield Co. , S.C. and brought to Fairfield Co. by Andrew and Mary Norris Feaster and raised by them. Also brought back with Laurence Feaster was his sisters Elizabeth and Irene and brother Andrew Feaster . "

Notes on Laurence /Laurnes Feaster.

His mother was a Cates . From David Roe Feaster's diary , 14 Dec. 1886 - "Mary Feaster is dead from measles . She is the daughter of Laurence Feaster . Two years ago he lost his wife (Sue) and one daughter , and now to lose the eldest of the surviors . Laurence was descended from John Feaster (of Edgefield Co., S.C.) a nephew of Andrew Feaster

From Edrington's History page 38 - " Andrew Feaster had a cousin , John Feaster , who came at the same time and settled in Edgefield Co., S.C. He was the great grandfather of Laurens Feaster of the " Dark Corner " section .

From Bell C. Feaster's diary; neice of J.C. Feaster - Oct. 1861.

" Dr. Press C. Coleman has a large company called the " Dark Conner Zauavers " Ches. Crosby, Dave Crosby and Tom Crowder said they would not go."

Dr. Press Coleman was married to a Miss Secrest of Lancaster . He was a Capt. in the Company C. , 17th South Carolina Regiment , He was a brother to Dr. Robert Williams Coleman . [Dr. Coleman built my house in 1850].

From American Life Histories: Federad Writers Project 1936- 1940. project # 3613. Miss Jennie Isabel Coleman " Our section was a long distance from a railroad; in fact, the extreme northern portion was called " the dark corner ".

Nancy Coleman to Guy Ross Friday Morning Shelton S.C. Jul 21, 1923

...

"Today brings fourth the second picnic of the season . It is over in the corner of the county know as the "dark corner" . It has the right name too . There are the most " tacks " in that settlement of any other place I know of . In spite of all this we are going to be right there to add to the number . [Nancy Coleman is the neice of Mary Bess Coleman that lived in the Robert Williams Coleman house . They are going from here to " dark corner"]

One of Andrew Jackson McConnell's plantations was called Dark Corner . Andrew Jackson McConnell was born 1808 and died 28 Aug. 1855 , He lived over by the Broad River above Shelton going up towars the N.W. corner of the county .

From Jacob Feaster's diary 26 Feb. 1863 " went up to Dark Corner dined with Sue and Larunce Feaster Came home ".

From William Edringtons History of Fairfield Co., S.C. 188 page 47 . " (adjoining J.F.V. Legg) Further north we had Meredith Poole Meador , who owned the place occupied by Laurens Feaster .
