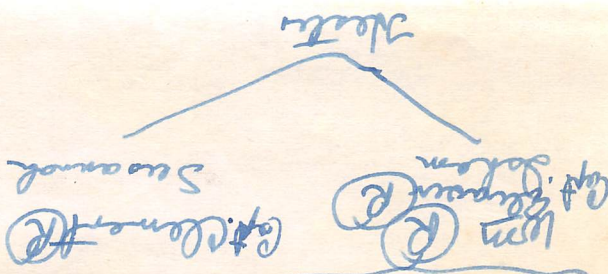

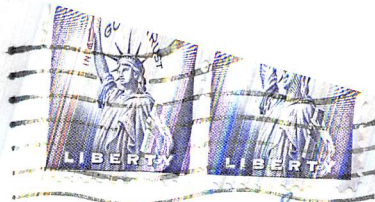

and sent me one - I'll be so

glad to ask him send me the
negative so I can have you one or
more made -

my leg has improved some,
tho am using cane yet.

you - and reached Pompano B.

at 9:30 P.M. that night -
Her letter to-day said Betsy, Skip
and two larger girls went to Birm-
ingham recently to visit Skips,

you come by to see me and tell

me and the "ole place" - I love living
