

The Feasters came to America from the Canton of Berne, Switzerland - they came from Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, to Fairfield County, South Carolina.

I Andrew Feaster first to South Carolina, (a widower with one daughter Margaret) ^{up Lancaster Co., Pa.} Margaret Feaster ^{up Philadelphia, Pa.} widow with two children (she was a Fry before marriage). Their children as follows:

Robert Roe Coleman, 3rd son (of Robert and Elizabeth Roe Coleman) and Nancy Coleman, his 1st cousin, and settled near his father and brother David (Daddy Dan). The place now owned by Henry Taylor. Robert Hiram Coleman, (3rd child of Robert Roe ^{Coleman} and Nancy Coleman). m^d. Julia Ann Peaslee.

They had two boys, Lewis Andrew, and Robert Fraser Coleman - The latter was shot accidentally by a companion, when 19 yrs. old, while hunting, and died from loss of blood. Lewis, m^d. ZURA (MAZURA) Carter. They had seven children - Live in Fla. where his mother went a widow, with the two little boys in Dec. 1867. The father, Robert Hiram Coleman, died of fever in Augusta, Ga., June 24th 1862.

Edward Coleman (4th child of Robert Roe Coleman & wife Nancy m^d. Nancy E. Coleman (grand dau. of William Coleman, who was bro. of Robert Coleman 15th) They had no children.

Dr. Hiram S. Coleman, youngest of Hiram Henry Coleman and wife Betty Beam Coleman's children, died of consumption

John and Drusilla Mobley Feaster) They went to
Winston Co. Miss., about 1850. A grand daughter
^{of Griffin} Visited Feasterville, 3 yrs ago - She was Minnie
^{D. 1877} Coleman Johnson.

Another son, William Coleman (called Buck)
Went to Texas from Miss., and Coleman County
Texas is named for him. He m^d, a miss Head
lure from South Carolina.

Robert Fitz Coleman, (1st son of David Roe Coleman
and wife Edith Beau, and grandson of
Robert Coleman, and Elizabeth Roe Coleman),
born, Aug. 26th, 1789, died Sept. 7th 1842 -

Drusilla Mobley Feaster - she died, Jan. 15th
1829 - Thir Children:

lived only six months. She later m^{d.} James
Brennan, had one child and it died.
She then m^{d.} John G. Arnette, all of this
before she was 20 yrs. old. Had four
children by Arnette. After his death, late
in life she m^{d.} Wesley Mayfield, who

still lives, aged 90 yrs - (this was written in the early 1900s)
all of her children are dead - The last one, Dr. Robert
Coleman Arnett, left three sons and two daughters.
Dr. Arnett died in 1908 - Buried at Salem Church -
Eliza, ^{his mother} died in 1890 and is buried near Buena
Vista (Uncle Wm Feaster home ^(Hall)) in what is
known as Coleman graveyard.
