Thank you for your kind response. I did notice that you have a picture misidentified in the Ford files on line. It's identified as Dorrel Ford and Malinda Caroline Gibson. They were married in 1837 when she was just sixteen (born about 1821) and he was 44. My great uncle, James Love Ford, told me a story passed down from his grandfather, John Faust Ford, son of Dorrel, that the children from Dorrel's first marriage did not like their new stepmother at all, even putting burrs under her saddle, hoping she'd come to grief in a fall from her horse. Actually, Caroline (she went by her middle name) outlived Dorrel who died 4 February 1861. They had a large family which I will post to you soon.

The picture is actually one of his son, Pinkney Dorrel Ford and his wife, Caroline Scarborough who married shortly after the Civil War. Pink (as his family called him) was never in good health after being a prisoner in a union prison camp in Nashville. They had two boys but he died when they'd been married about 3 years. I'll look up the exact dates. After Pink died, Caroline took the two boys to Mississippi to live with her parents. I don't know if she ever remarried. (As you can imagine, there was a shortage of men in the South after the war, just as there was in Great Britain after World War 1.)

I'd be curious to know where the picture came from. I have a copy of it myself, and I think my grandmother got it from her parents. She's the one who identified the couple to me.

I'm a descendant of William Gardner Ford (d. 1805, Fairfield County) and his wife Magdalen Love (d 1837, Greene County AL; daughter of Robert Love and cousin to Isaac Love of Fairfield County). I've been researching the Fords of Fairfield for over 40 years. My cousin Sidney Ford Tatum published a book on William Gardner Ford's brother Nathaniel and his line from which she's descended. I read it and gave her some corrections I'd identified in my research which she promised to correct in her next book, but she never got around to doing a second book and a few years ago her vision was failing and she went to live with her daughter up North. Most of the errors were not in her line, but in William Gardner Ford's line that she mentioned throughout the book. So if anyone is using her book as a primary source (it's really a secondary source; estate papers and court records are a primary source), ask them to contact me to verify the correctness of the information on anyone in William Gardner Ford's line. I'll be glad to help anyone who is researching my line or any line connected with it.

I've also taught classes (I was on the board of directors for years in Burbank, California of the Southwestern Genealogical Society) in researching difficult issues and some of the findings that one can make that show errors in past research. I'll be happy to contribute to the newsletter articles that deal with such subjects if you would be interested.

The Fords are now spread far and wide since they lived in Fairfield at the time of the Revolution (Craven County then) and until the 1830s. Some cousins and I, all trained researchers, are continuing to trace the family. I'd be happy to share all my findings, including the parentage of William Gardner Ford, Nathaniel Ford, Hezekiah Ford, Elizabeth Ford (married Burrell Burge), and Martha Keziah Ford (married Nicholas Peay). Many of William Gardner Ford's children moved to western Alabama in the 1830s, including his son Dorrel Ford through whom I'm descended. Many in the next generation moved to MS, then to Texas.

I'd be glad to prepare a short history of the family and its links in Fairfield to other families. I do have a question. Does the newsletter ever publish queries? It seems an ideal place to have queries about genealogical research problems. I have one that

I've searched for many years. Susanna, first wife of Dorrel Ford died 27 September 1834 in Greene County AL the day after giving birth to her ninth child. I know her birthdate but have been unable to find her parents or her maiden name. Her birthdate is 19 July 1789. That's the kind of query I had in mind to be able to post in the newsletter. I didn't see any queries in the current issue of the newsletter on line.

I am completing the online application and submit my membership fee. Hopefully, I can get back to SC to do some more research in Fairfield and the State Archives early next year. I had to take time off from genealogy for some health problems, now thankfully resolved. Doing genealogical research inspired me to take a mid-career break and go to law school to help with estate issues and wills. Although technically retired, I still do a fair amount of legal work for a consulting firm in which I own a part interest.

My goal is by next year or the year after I'll be able to move to SC (I live in FL currently). You can count on me then to be an avid volunteer in the library. I'm sure some old papers I filed there are still on file, but the findings in them are outdated and I'll be happy to submit records to bring them up to date. Would you like them on disk or in hard copy?

The only possible clues I have to her birth name are the names of her two oldest sons, Austin L. Ford and John Faust Ford (I've not been able to connect her to the Fausts in Fairfield or Richland counties. I'm wondering if she could be related to John Brown, Dorrel Ford's best friend, or whether she might belong to a neighboring family to Dorrel's father's property. Dorrel's father was William Gardner Ford (he usually went by his middle name) and Magdalen Love. Gardner died in Fairfield County in 1805. Magdalen died in Greene County AL in 1837.
