Thank you so much for the information about the parents of Elizabeth Griffin m. Gardner Ford. at a complete dead end since my only source of information , the L.M.Ford family history (in the Winnsboro Historical Society Library) merely gives the name "Betsy" Griffin.

Gardner Ford and Elizabeth Griffin had three sons: Eli, James Quilla (my great-grandfather), and William, and one daughter, Martha, who married \_\_\_Sauls. Gardner and Elizabeth migrated to Barbour County, Uncle Eli was the guardian of the sons of Alabama. James, who died young, presumably in the area around Winona, Mississippi. Uncle Eli was a rascal who spent the inheritance of his wards on his five daughter: and there was much family bitterness for several generations about his perfidity. I can't find out what happened to William or Martha.

There is a family Bible in the possession of Mrs. Henry Benbow, Luverne, Alabama, with the Eli Ford family information in it. Eli is buried at the Mount Ida Cemetary near Luverne, Alabama.

I shall send a copy of your information to the Winnsboro Historical Society Library.
