1805 - ADAM FREE TO GEORGE FREE - GIFT DEED. ADAM FREE, A BLACKSMITH, GAVE GEORGE FREE EVERYTHING HE HAD. RECORDED APRIL 19,1805.

1809 - ADAM FREE - SETTING ASIDE GIFT DEED TO GEORGE FREE. ADAM SAYS HE WAS NOT IN HIS RIGHT MIND WHEN HE GAVE GEORGE EVERYTHING. HE WANTS EVERYTHING BACK BE-CAUSE HE CAN LOOK AFTER HIMSELF NOW AND WHEN HE DIES, EVERYTHING IS TO BE DIVIDED EQUALLY AMONG HIS CHILDREN. (HE DOESN'T NAME HIS CHILDREN)

HARRIET MARTIN WAS BORN IN FAIRFIELD CO. ON 1851 AND DIED IN 1891 IN MONTECELLO, ... ARKANSAS. SHE FIRST MARRIED HARRISON AND HAD ONE SON CHARLES HARRISON (HE LIVED AND DIED IN TEXAS) HER SECOND MARRIAGE WAS TO CHARLES EDWARD WILSON. I DO NOT KNOW WHO HER FATHER WAS, BUT I FOUND THESE MARTINS IN SALEM PRESB. CHURCHYARD, NEAR SALEM CROSS ROADS IN FAIRFIELD CO. CAN YOU HELP? W.A. MARTIN - DIED APRIL 7, 1872 - AGED 70 YEARS II MO. 7 DA. (1802)

THESE STONES THAT SIT UP OFF OF THE GROUND INTERESTED ME. THESE PEOPLE WERE BURIED TO THE LEFT OF THE DAVIS MANSION ON THE HIGHWAY. TEN WERE MOVED TO LITTLE RIVER BAPTIST CHURCHYARD BEFORE THE WATER WAS BACKED UP, BUT I WAS TOLD THAT THERE WERE SOME THAT WERE NOT MOVED BECAUSE THEY WERE BROKEN UP. I FOUND THE ESTATE PAPERS OF JOHN DAVIS AND <u>CAPT.</u> JAMES DAVIS WHICH SHOCKED ME. YOU PROBABLY HAVE THIS, BUT JUST IN CASE YOU DON'T.

" IN MEMORY OF JOHN DAVIS, SON OF THE REV. JOHN DAVIS, PASTOR OF THE SECOND BAPTIST CHURCH, BOSTON. GRANDSON OF THE REV. DAVID DAVIS WHO IMIGRATED FROM WALES IN 1710 AND WHO WAS PASTOR OF THE WELSH TRACT CHURCH, PA.. HE REMOVED TO LONDON COUNTY, VIRGINIA AND FROM THENCE TO THIS PLACE A.D. 1770. HE HAD SEVEN SONS ENGADED IN THE WAR OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION BUT TWO OF WHOM SURVIVE THAT MEMORIAL CONTEST. THREE OF HIS SONS WERE SUCCESSIVE CAPTAINS OF THE SAME COMPANY. HE DEPARTED THIS LIFE MARCH 15,1785, IN THE 66th YEAR OF HIS AGE AND DIED AS HE LIVED A CHRISTIAN."

"TO THE MEMORY OF CAPTAIN JAMES DAVIS WHO SERVED OUR REPUBLIC AS A FAITHFUL SOLDIER AND OFFICER DURING THE REVOLUTIONARY WAR AND CONTINUED A FIRM PATRIOT TO HIS DEATH IN 1822. AGED 68 YEARS."

JONATHAN DAVIS WAS BORN IN FAIRFIELD CO. ON AUG. 18,1786 AND DIED ON OCT. 5, 1855. ON THE BOTTOM OF HIS MARBLE SLAB IS "MRS. DAVIS AND SIX OUTOF ELEVEN CHILD-REN SURVIVED HIM."

OF HOLCOMBE LEGION AND COMMANDED THE COURIERS OF GEN'L GUSTAVOUS W. SMITH IN VA. - REPRESENTED LEXINGTON COUNTY IN THE LEGIS -LATURE IN 1888- 89 - LIVED AND DIED A CHRISTIAN GENTLEMAN." ON DEC. 28,1832, CHARLES FREE, OF FAIRFIELD DISTRICT, BOUGHT 777 ACRES OF LAND FROM CHRISTIAN FRESHLY, A PLANTER OF LEXINGTON DISTRICT, FOR \$3500.00. THE FERRY LANDING AND THE ROAD LEADING TO THE LANDING WAS KEPT BY THE GRANTOR FOR HIS SON, JOSEPH FRESHLY. THIS ROAD EXTENDED FROM THE LANDING TO THE COLUMBIA ROAD.

ON AUG. I, 1832, (PAGE 351) SALE BILL FROM CHRISTAIN FRESHLY TO CHARLES FREE FOR 4 NEGROS, VIZ-SHARLOTTE, ELIZA, SARAH, AND BILL, I MARE, IO HEAD OF ----STOCK, 24 HEAD OF STOCK HOGS AND IO HEAD OF SHEEP FOR \$914.00.

THERE ARE THREE FREE CEMETERYS. ONE IS UNDER WATER, ONE A ROAD RUNS THROUGH AND ONE BEHIND THE HOME OF CHARLES AND HARRIETT FREE. CHARLES LOST HIS LAND TO HIS SON IN LAW, GEORGE W. DE HEHNS
