Gaston has a masters degree in counseling.

"I'm an advocate for academics.

I believe in parental support. I believe that it takes the parent, church, community and school to

educate a child. We have to be supportive of our wildren, but also of teachers. We should look to them as professionals and respect them. We must pay them well, and hold them accountable."

Gaston said she is running again because there is more to do.

"We need to improve our standards. We are growing; we have a vision to rise to

the top. I had very strong teachers, so I know what education does. It affords you liberty and you can live a nice life. We have to have it," she said.

Gaston is the adult services supervisor at DSS. She is married to John Gaston, and they have three sons. She's an elder at Shiloh First Presbyterian Church.
