Mrs. Willingham Dies Wednesday At Greenville

Mrs. W. H. Willingham, 79, life-long resident of Winnsboro, died Wednesday (yesterday) morning at 7:30 o'clock in the Greenville General hospital. Although she had been in declining health for some time, the end came unexpectedly.

She is survived by one daughter, Kathleen Willingham, district Welfare Director of Greenville, with whom she was making her home just prior to her death.

Funeral services, conducted by her pastor, the Rev. Arthur M. Martin, assisted by Dr. S. C. Byrd, are to be held from the Sion Presbyterian church Thursday afternoon at 3:30 o'clock and interment will be in the church cemetery.

Active pallbearers will be M. H. Doty, W. A. Robinson, Ernest Stevenson, George Moore, J. B. Walker, E. P. Blair. Elders and deacons of the church will act as honorary pallbearers.

Mrs. Willingham, who was the former Lula Rommédy, was very active in the civic and religious life of the community. She was a member of the Cultus club, the Woman's Civic League (predecessor to the Woman's club), the U. D. C. and the D. A. R., and up until her last illness she took a keen interest in these organizations.

John H. Gibson, Coroner For 29 Years, Dies In Columbia Jan. 19

John Hollis Gibson, 76, coroner of Fairfield county for more than 29 years, died Saturday evening at 7 p. m., in the Columbia hospital, after an extended illness of many months.

Mr. Gibson was born in the Biddle section of Fairfield and had spent virtually his entire life here. In December, 1916, he succeeded the late Thomas F. Smith as county coroner and had served continuously in this office since that date.

He was a Mason and had recently been issued a life membership in this organization, and was a member of the Baptist church.

Mr. Gibson is survived by one daughter, Mrs. C. McMullan of Columbia; four grandchildren, William, Lewis and Paul Dennis and James John Chappell, all of Columbia; and four great-grandchildren.

Funeral services, which were in the charge of the Masons, were held from the First Baptist church Winnsboro, at 3 o'clock Monday afternoon.
