

Little River Baptist Church

Little River Baptist Church is located about 11 miles southwest of Winnsboro on State Road 213, about one mile east of State Road 215. Grave locations start on the right-front as you enter the cemetery. The names marked with "#" are grave that were moved to Little River in 1976 from the Jonathan Davis Cemetery when Lake Monticello was constructed. This cemetery was located behind the former Davis House on Highway 215.
