David Evans, his wife, Mary Read Evans, and children emigrated from London, England to Charleston in 1784. He received his citizenship in Charleston in 1785, after which he and the family moved to Fairfield County. 35

David Reed Evans (1770-1843) practised law and became Judge of Ordinary in Fairfield County. He and his father were among the founders of Sion Presbyterian Church. In 1804 he began service as in public office, continuing intermittently until 1832. Margaret Winn, a daughter of John Winn, was his first wife, His second marriage was in Nancy Malinda Yongue, daughter of Rev. Samuel Yongue. There were no heirs by either marriage. 70
