John and Sarah Duncan Gill's son Robert, born 1765, Lancaster Pa and died 1856 Clark Co Ill. He is



the on the 1850 Census and was married, so can be eliminated at Knox Co

Shelton's Book: : "Rev John Simpson congregation at Fishing Creek (1774-76), included Robert Gill, James Gill, and John Gill". Also John Mills who probably married Mary Gill.

Ref: Draper Manuscripts: an unnamed Gill, sister of Robert Gill, all from Ireland to NJ.

Robert Gill Sr (wife Eleanor) too old to serve, sent son's Thomas, Robert Jr, Archibald, John and James into Whig forces. I believe these are the same referred to in Rev Simpson Congregation. Don't believe that this Robert Jr went to Kox Co Ind, either.

The Robert who appears on Indiana Census' is definately the one with the Shakers, but I have exhausted my efforts as to who he is or belongs to, any ideas??????
