

STATE OF KENTUCKY  
LOGAN COUNTY

On this day of December 1833 personally appeared before the Justice of the County Court of Logan County in the state of Kentucky, now sitting, ROBERT GILL a resident of said County of Logan in the state aforesaid aged sixty nine years who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provisions made by the Act of Congress passed June 7, 1832.

That he was born in the state of Pennsylvania in the year 1764. He derives the information from the record of his father's family Register. At an early period of his life he removed with his father to Chester County in the State of South Carolina. In the year of 1781 he was drafted in said County of Chester to serve a tour of duty of three months in the militia of South Carolina, his rendezvous at one Cameron's Tavern in the County aforesaid. He was placed in a company commanded by James Ramsey, John Adair was Major and William Adair, his brother was Colonel. Commandant of the Regiment to which he was attached from hence he was marched to Orangeburg and there stationed to guard a number of Tories, during the time he was stationed here he was detailed to accompany and guard certain waggons which were loaded with stores and provisions for Gen. Green's Army which lay in the neighborhood of Charlestown. He returned to his regiment at Orangeburg until the three months had expired for which he was drafted. He was discharged at Orangeburg but did not receive a written discharge for said three month tour of duty.

In the early part of the year of 1832 he enlisted in the Army of the United States for the time of one year at the house of Captain Mills in Chester County, South Carolina and said Captain Mills was the officer who enlisted him, from the house of of said Mills he was detached with others under a sergeant Cameron to the R\_\_\_\_\_ of Sandy River in pursuit of certain Tories who were plundering in this part of the state, they only succeeded in capturing one Tory during this trip. The service which he performed was principally of this character as said Captian Mills company was employed principally as Rangers during the time of his enlistment. He served the tour of twelve months as above stated without having been attached to the main Army. He was disbanded in said County of Chester but he did not receive a written discharge therefor.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present and declares that his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any State.
