Deacon Reuben Hall, one of the pioneers of Pine Grove Baptist Church. He will be remembered as a true example of real christian discipleship.

Reuben Hall, an ex-slave, was born in the Crane Creek section of Richland County, and spent most of his life in the Mitford Community where he worked as a farmer and blacksmith on Jimmie Caldwell's plantation. As a slave, he helped to make the bricks for Bethesda Methodist Church, which still stands in the Mitford Community. His life was a living example of love, sincere devotion and loyalty to God and His church.
