Mimphy, the sum of Two Hundred (\$200) Dollars each, in
cash.

Fourth - I give devise and bequeath to Estelle Guffey, a trust
now on my place, the sum of Twenty (\$20) Dollars, in cash.

Fifth - I give, devise and bequeath to my sons Nathan and
Foster Gladden all the balance of my estate, both real and
personal, share and share alike.

Sixth - I hereby appoint my two sons, Nathan and Foster Gladden
executors of this my last will and testament to serve without bond.
