On the way home we stopped in Medon, Tennessee, and were fortunate to find an elderly gentleman, who was an old time resident, and he took us to the grave of James Gladney who was, as you know, a son of Samuel's. It is difficult to find because it is a small private cemetery which has grown up in brush, etc. We were able, however, to prop up the tombstones and obtain color photos of both James' and his wife Nancy Agnes Young's graves with the tombstones' lettering still visible. His son, Joseph Patrick, who moved to Harmony Hill, Rusk County, Texas, was my greatgrandfather.

Thomas and Richard Gladney land warrants were dated 1-7-1771,
and possible may be given in this JOURNAL. Jane Gladney's
was dated 4-30-1771. The chances are that they arrived during that
first week in January. This is where I had to stop, and have not
been able to get back to the Archives since.

If you find that the 1880 Census is too faded, and if you think the
1770 Census will be of any value you may substitute it. Someone told me
that census was done by the negro carpet baggers, and just anything was
written down. That was a rumor, and I have never tried to check it out.
Anyway, if you think it is authentic, and the 1880 fails us, try the 1770.

Check the Elliot reference for me please for the information indicated.
You've no idea how I shall appreciate your help in doing this reading. Send
me your bill as you see any chance to do it, with the reading of previously.

"A diligent search of historical documents in the S. Carolina Archives Library did not produce the name of the ship on which Jane Wilson Gladney came to the colony." A list of petitioners for warrants of survey from the Leg. Coun. Journal Vol. 36, Part I, pp 201-204, dated Thurs. day, 30 October 1771, includes the name of Jane Gladney and numerous Strongs. The name of the ship was not given, but the time when she applied for land is shown.
