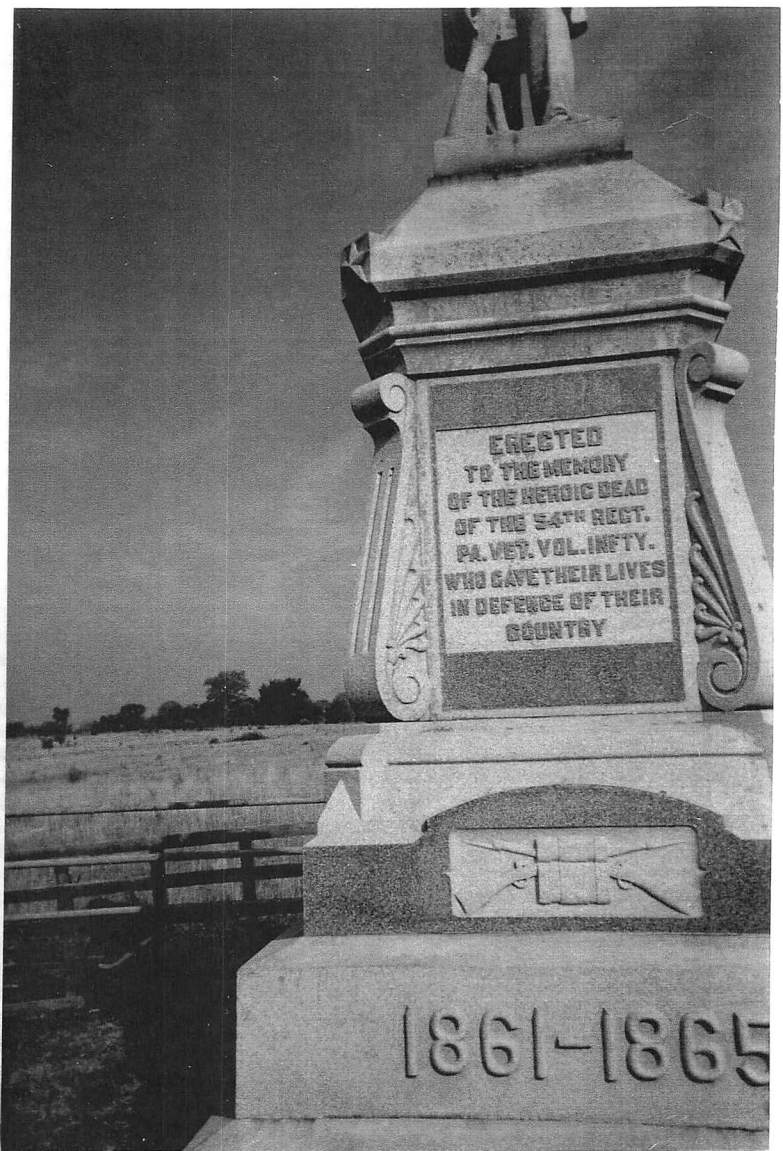
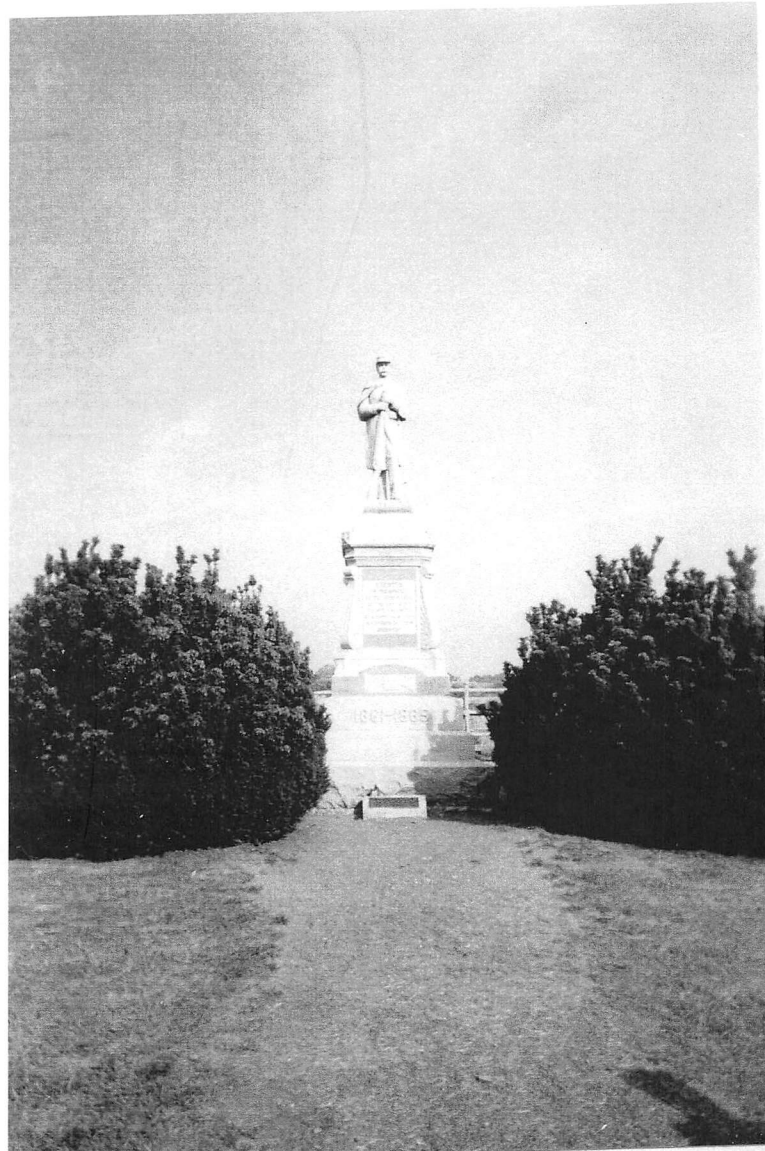

**BATTLE OF NEW MARKET**

ON THE HILLS TO THE NORTH TOOK PLACE THE BATTLE OF NEW MARKET, MAY 15, 1864. THE UNION ARMY UNDER GENERAL FRAZAR SIGEL, FACED SOUTHWEST. JOHN C. BRECKINRIDGE, ONCE VICE-PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, COMMANDED THE CONFEDERATES. COLONEL SCOTT SHIPP COMMANDED THE CADET CORPS OF THE VIRGINIA MILITARY INSTITUTE WHICH DISTINGUISHED ITSELF, CAPTURING A BATTERY, THE BATTLE ENDED IN SIGEL'S RETREAT NORTHWARD.

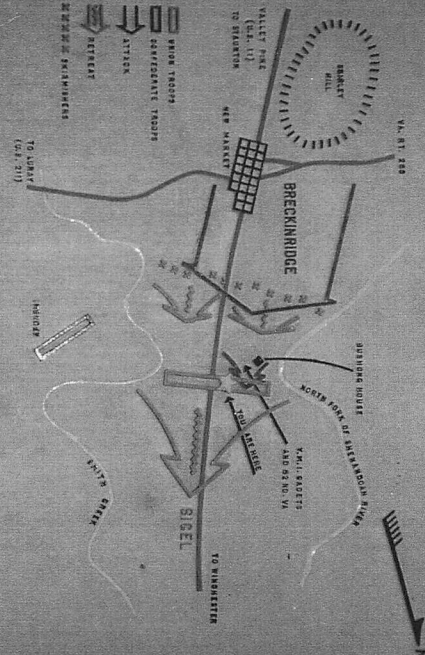


**BATTLE OF NEW MARKET**  
MAY 15, 1864

General G. Crook's plan to defeat the Confederacy in 1864, called for a raid by General G. Crook into southwestern Virginia. General Sigel's task was to keep the Confederates from concentrating against Crook, was to advance down Shenandoah Valley from the Harper's Ferry area. Striking Breckinridge's infantry drove Sigel's troops from the ridge south of Dunbar House. The VMI Cadets moved up from the rear, and along with the 62nd Virginia, charged across a ridge, broke the Union line and captured several cannons. The rest of the Confederates fled forward, and Sigel's troops were driven from the field.

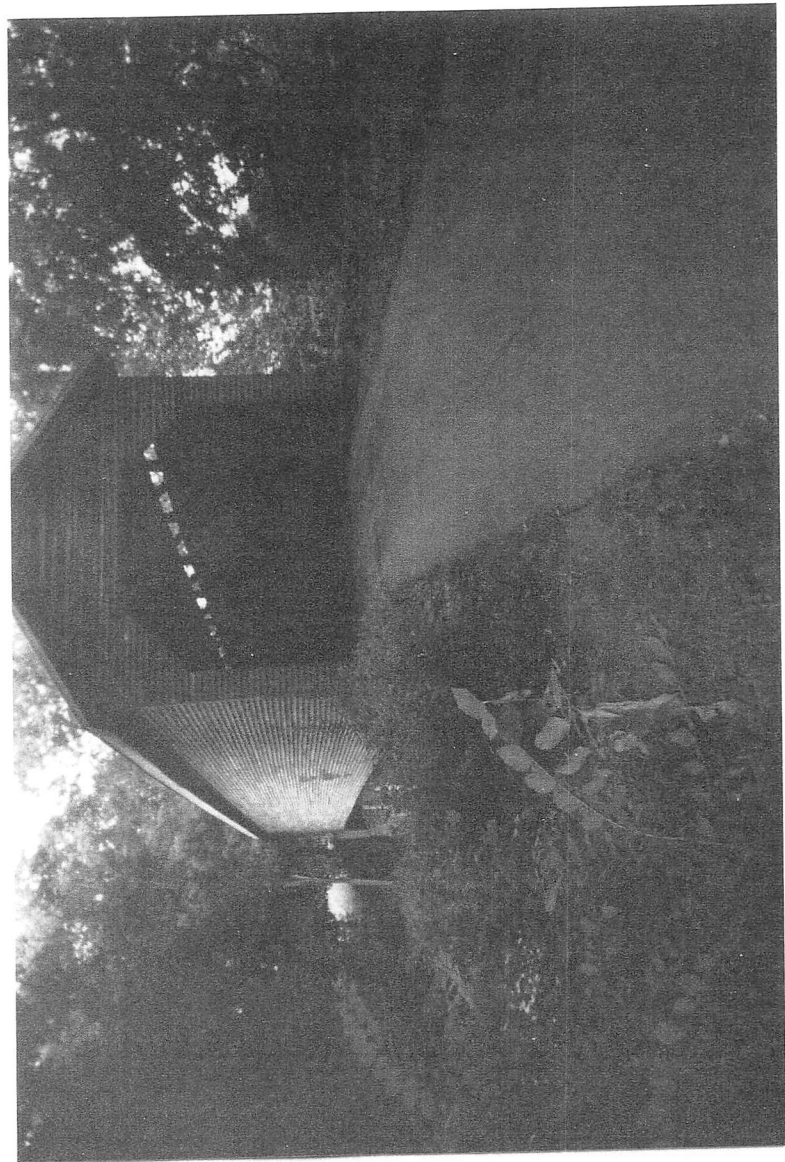
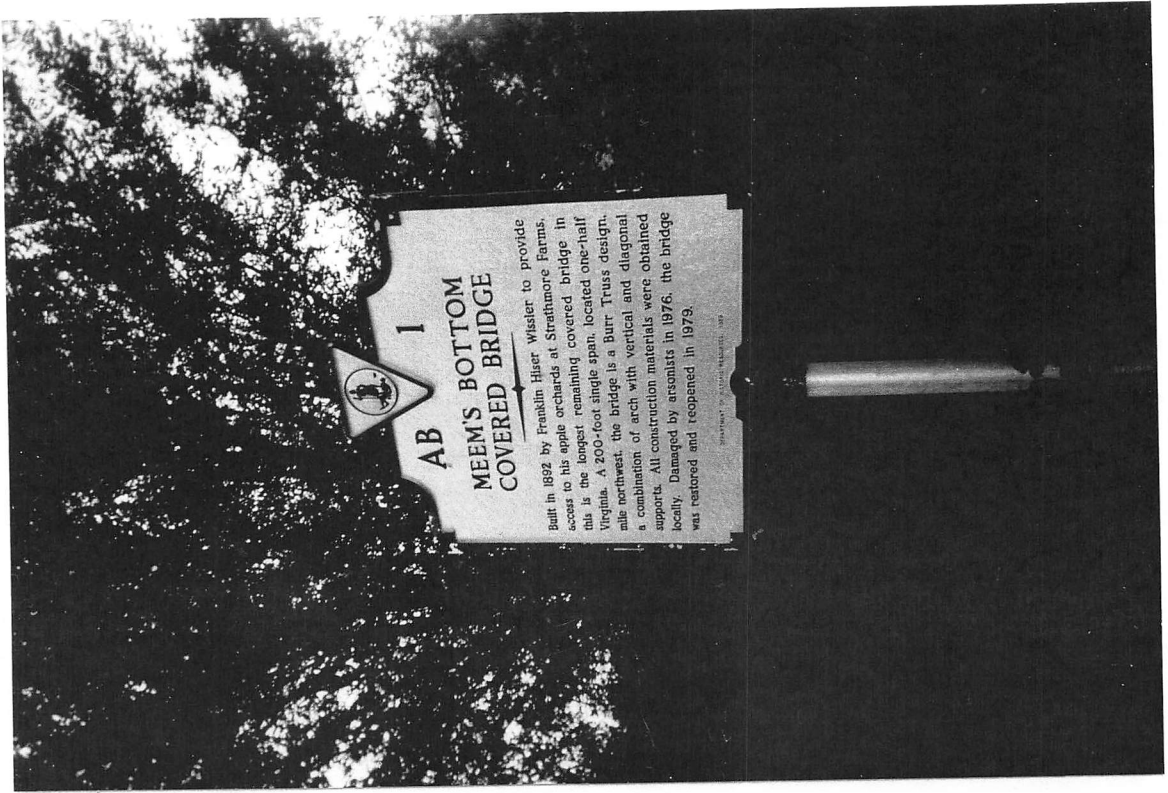
