Charles Gladney born in 7-16-1787, the 7th son of Richard III, died 7-13-1828. Buried in Gladney Cemetery in Fairfield Co. S.C. Frist married to Mary Camthen no record of children or of her death.

Second marriage to Nancy Gladney, she was the daughter of Thomas Gladney. Nancy and Charles were first cousins. Nancy died in 1838, no record of here burial place. All of their children were born in South Carolina. The Gladneys were in migration about this time. But beleive that Nancy would be buried in South Carolina.

Their oldest son, Joseph died in 1851, and is buried in Fellowship Cemetery, Reform, Ala. in Pickens County.

William Strong met Margaret Hanna in Pickens County Ala. They were married in Winston County Miss. in Jan. 17, 1856.

All the other married and lived in Miss. No record of how long they might have stayed in Pickens Co. Ala.

Jane Strong Gladney married Alexander Thompson Hanna prior to 1850. Alexander had come to Miss. with his parents, then returned to S.C. and married Jane Strong and brought her to Miss. Settling on a farm in Winston Co. near Bethsalem Church in Winston Co.

Alexander Thompson Hanna B-10-17-1827, was a brother to Margaret Elizabeth Hanna, who had married William Strong Gladney brother to Jane Strong Gladney

Agnes Gladney - No record of birth, died during the war from Diphtheria, about Five years of age.

John Gladney - No record of birth, died very young near the death of Agnes.

William Strong Gladney purchased 160 acres of land in Winston Co. Section (3) three, township (15) fifteen South of Range (11) Eleven East. This was done on Jan.8,1855, for the sum of (850.00) eight hundred and fifty dollars.

On Jan.17,1856 there was a marriage license issued to William S. Gladney and Margaret Elizabeth Hanna. Some records said they were married in Pickens Co. Ala. Most likely they met in Pickens or Green Co. Ala. Margaret Grandfather Samuel Hanna moved from South Carolina to Greene Co. Ala.in 1829. Samuel and wife Sarah Young are buried in Cemetery of old Bethsalem Presby. Church on U.S. Highway 11 in Boligee, Ala.

William Strong was a 2nd Cpl. in the New Prospect Grays a Volunteer Co. from Winston Co. Miss organized in 1861. New Prospect was southwest of Concord Bap. Church. The only building left is a old antbellum home and a plaque that states this was New Prospect, Miss.

Cpl. Gladney died March 29,1864 in Casvill Ga. in a hospital, at this time I don't know if Casvill Ga. was a town or a army camp.

After the war Margaret Married Lt. James Weir, he was Cpl. Gladney commanding officer during the war. They had enlisted together in the New Prospect Grays. I beleive that Cpl. Gladney may have ^{Asix 20} Lt. Weir to help look after his family, which was four little girls the oldest about ten years old, and his wife. This is only my belief. Lt. Weir married Margaret and moved to Choctow Co. He and his brother John founded the town of Weir, they built a home on land that is owned by the Henery Oliver family, the old home was torn down in the late 1970s. Lt. Weir treated the Gladney girls the same as his own children.

James Weir (Son of Thomas and Isabella McKee Weir)

Born 7-4-1835, Old Union, Ala. Died 10-13 1905 Buried at Weir, Miss. Married Margaret Hanna Gladney she was born Jan. 1836 and Died 7-5-1910, Buried at Weir with her husband James. There is only one tomb to their graves. These are the children born to them.

John and James Weir Est. the town of Weir, John built a water mill on what is now Yaukanutney canal, it was a creek at that time. He had a large mill pond and lumber mill along with a grist mill. The mill pond was gathering place in the summer for the family.

Hanna Rebecca my grandmother ^{told} us as small children that she had milked cows where the I.C. Depot ¹ stood in Weir, Miss. The depot and rails had been removed prior to 1986. They were raised about one half mile south east of Weir, the house had been torn down prior to 1986.

Grandmother also told us about the Moore family which had some blind children. She said that you could hear them at all hours of the nite, tapping the nails back in on their paling fences, that the sun had caused to back out. We would ask how they could do it at nite. She would laugh and say that ^{they could see} as good at nite as in the day. They would work by feeling the paling to see if it was loose. She had to know the Moore Family before Margaret Married Lt. Weir. The Moores and William S. Gladney homesteads were in the Bethsalem Community.

After marrying William Walter Bowie they lived about three-quarter of a mile from Tibby creek. She said that often dogs would run deer in the swamp, the deer would become tired and go into the creek and keep the dogs fought off. That they would hear dogs when they had the deer at bay, then some one would go down and kill the deer. Then feed the dogs good for a day or two untill they were rested, then tie the deer tail around one of their necks and run them off. Hoping they would go home.

Grandmother would see you bare headed in sun in the summer, she would tell you to get a hat on before the sun baked your brain. She always wore a sun bonnet and apron that tied around her waist. For more inf. see the Bowie line.

Will give a partial record of two more of Charles Gladney children here. Nancy Matilda Gladney and Richard Gladney 4th, for they tie back into my family. And their descentants have left quite an impact on Choctow, Winston and Attala Countries.

William James Gladney married Elizabeth Jane Harden on Mar.20,1873. They lived on their farm in Choctow Co all their lives. He died Nov.1,1910, she died on Dec. 22,1929. Both are buried at Salem Meth. Church in Choctow Co.

Willie Strong Gladney married Estel Didimus Bowie, Dec. 18, 1883. Aunt Will was listed as a boy in one of the census. Aunt Will was the only one Grandma's sister that I knew, I remember Aunt Alice coming one time, they lived in the Delta, near Drew, Miss.

If I ever saw Aunt Katherine I don't remember it.

Miriam Lorine Fridy, born 11-24-14, graduated from Jenkinsville High and Columbia College. She was a home demonstration agent in Clarendon County and married Muldrow B. Rigby of Manning. They have two children.

The Franklin Family

George Harold Franklin and his wife, Anita Howie Franklin, came to the Greenbrier Community of Fairfield County in 1974, after having built a retirement cottage on Mossy Dale Road. George Franklin was born in Bradford, Pennsylvania, August 28, 1916, the second son of Horace George and Fern Jewell Franklin. He was reared on a farm in Warren County, Pennsylvania, and entered military service when the National Guard was federalized in 1941. He was sent to Europe in October of 1943 (three months after his marriage), where he fought in Africa, Italy and France. He again entered combat in Korea in 1952. After twenty years of service he retired as a Lieutenant Colonel and became involved in real estate and insurance sales in Columbia. He again retired when he sold his insurance and real estate agency and took up

gardening in Fairfield County.

Anita Franklin, the second daughter of William McIlwain Howie and Gladys Bouknight Howie, was born March 25, 1923, and reared in Columbia. After moving to Fairfield County she became a legal secretary in the Town of Winnsboro. She and her husband are the parents of a daughter, Nancy Franklin Mancill, and a son, George Harold (Binks) Franklin, Jr.

Nancy Mancill is the mother of two daughters, Elizabeth Buxton Mancill and Caroline Anita Mancill.

Binks Franklin and his wife, Marsha Jackson Franklin, are the parents of two daughters, Heather Rhea Franklin and Abby Louise Franklin, and three sons, George Harold (Tracy) Franklin, III, Benjamin Scott Franklin and Matthew Elias Franklin.

Gladneys in America

More than two hundred years ago the colonial government of South Carolina made an investment in settlers to colonize its territories inland from the coast. The Settlement Act of 1761, passed July 25, by the General Assembly of the colony, under consent of His Majesty, George III, awarded prospective settlers land for homesteading and as bounty, upkeep for a year.

It was this Act under which the first members of the Gladney Family entered the port of Charleston, South Carolina. It is doubtful that they were concerned with little except difficulties of the present. They were, nevertheless, committing themselves and their descendants to the Great Adventure of settling and exploring a continent, and of building a new nation.

On the morning of January 12, 1768, the Clerk of the Assembly reported to the Council, as recorded in the Council Journal, No. 34, p-24-33. "In pursuance of His Excellency the Governor's directive, I have this day been on board the snow (a type of ship), James and Mary, John Moore, Master, out of Larne, and administered oaths to such of the poor Protestants as were of age who had lately arrived in her into this Province on en-

couragement of Bounty given in the Act of the General Assembly of the Province, passed July 25, 1761--"

The clerk submitted the names of those to whom he had administered the oath, and the number of acres of land to which each was entitled. On this list, page 100, is the name of Samuel Gladney, (spelled Glegney), 30 years old; Mary Gladney, 28; and Joseph Gladney, 21. A diligent search of historical documents in the South Carolina Archives Library did not produce the name of the ship on which Jane Wilson Gladney, widow, and her two sons, Richard and Thomas, came to the colony. It is possible that these three members of the family came much earlier than Samuel and Joseph, preempted the land, and waited for survey as was customary.

Official survey of the land granted to Samuel was made "pursuant to a precept directed by the Honorab. E.M. Leigh, Esq., Surveyor General, dated 12th day of January, 1768" and duly certified March 5, 1786. His land, 150 acres, was bounded on all sides by "vacant land", rectangular in shape, and was situated on a small branch of Jackson's Creek, Craven County, now Fairfield. Later Samuel received another grant of 100 acres in the same vicinity. Richard and Thomas Gladney he-

grants of 100 acres each. The survey plats for which were completed and certified in 1771. Joseph's land was surveyed in 1772. Jane Wilson Gladney, widow, received her survey plat in 1773.

Joseph Gladney was a surveyor. Fitzhugh McMaster, in his history of Fairfield County, S.C., Chapter II, p. 16, wrote, "John Phillips, who during the Revolution was a Colonel in the British Army, had 2050 acres in land grants from 1761 to 1774. All of these were not in Fairfield County. John Winn and Joseph Gladney were surveyors for some of these."

Joseph's land located on a small branch of Jackson's Creek and the waters of Little River, adjoined the grants of Jane McBride, Archibald Paul, Ann Martin, Robert Martin, John Phillips, for whom he had been surveying, and Thomas Gladney. Thomas Gladney's 100 acres were situated on Reedy Branch of Jackson's Creek, bounded by land of John Phillips, Bartholomew Austin, and vacant land. The survey was made by Richard Winn, and certified February 10, 1771. Richard Gladney's tract was laid out in the shape of a square. Corner posts were indicated as "pine, post oak, red oak and old post oak". His neighbor on the northwest was Hugh McDaniel. Jane Wilson's land grant was irregular in shape, due, no doubt to the small branch of Jackson's Creek which rose on the northeast side of the property, and continued to the southeast corner. Drury Osten's land and Conally's grant bordered Jane Gladney's on the south and east. The survey was certified February 1, 1773 by Alexander Turner, Deputy Surveyor. The document given to Jane Gladney to certify her land grant, bearing the official seal of the Government, also bore the word "Bounty" transcribed across it. She was the only member of the Gladney immigrants whose grant was thus marked. There is no tradition in the family concerning the degree or conditions of her needs at the time she entered this country.

The journey from Charleston to the "Up-Country" required about three weeks.

The story of the "Widow Gladney" and her sons who became a part of the history of this country some 200 years ago is told here in deep appreciation for those generations now reaching across the continent. No effort has been made to trace the Gladney origin overseas. The tentative genealogy, in Northern Ireland, was contributed by Henry Grady Gladney, of Kansas City, Missouri. Tradition in all branches of the family maintains that early in the seventeenth century some members of the family emigrated from Scotland to County Antrim, Northern Ireland. Early researchers, working before records in Ireland were burned, confirmed these claims, without documentation. The coat of arms, used as a frontispiece, is treasured by earlier researchers including the late Mrs. Jane Gladney Butler, member of the Institute of American Genealogy.

Jane Wilson Gladney, a widow, emigrated to Charleston in the 1760's with four sons. She and her sons received land grants in Fairfield County, South Carolina. They had come from County Antrim, Northern Ireland. The father in this family, Richard Gladney II, had died in Ireland in 1754. The four sons were: Samuel, who married Agnes McCreight; Joseph, no record of marriage; Richard III, who married Jane Strong; and Thomas, who married Agnes Martin.

Jane Gladney and her four sons built homes, and developed their land grants in Fairfield County. Upon their deaths they were buried in the Gladney Cemetery located on their own land south of Lebanon Presbyterian Church. The cemetery has been restored by present family members and is well preserved considering it's early beginning.

Grandsons and granddaughters of Jane Wilson Gladney, along with many other families, moved westward, to other states, most receiving land grants, which may have induced them to move.

Like many early settlers the Gladneys and their descendants are to be found in many states. Mildred Gladney Arnold, author of the book, "Gladneys in America", is of the opinion that there is no other Gladney family living in this country other than the one originating in Fairfield County.

The movie, "Blossoms In The Dust", starring Greer Garson and Walter Pidgeon, was based on Mrs. Sam Gladney's dedication to children and her efforts to have "illegitimate" removed from birth records which most states have now adopted.

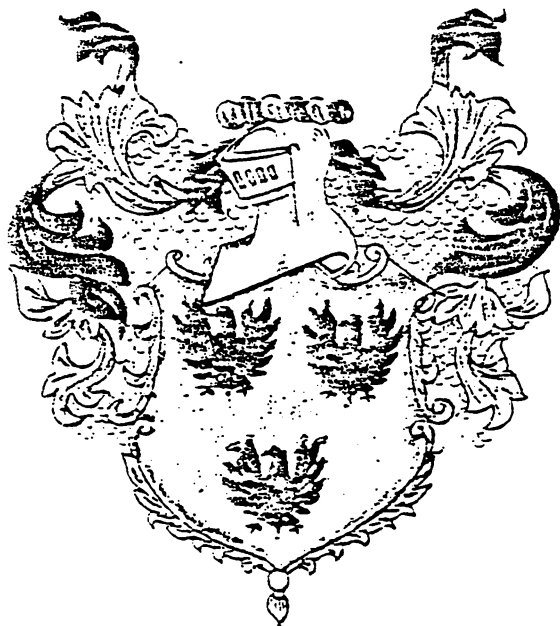
A national association of the Descendants of Richard II and Jane Gladney is incorporated in South Carolina, and a reunion is held once a year, the last weekend of July, in Winnsboro.

Gladney Coat of Arms

Gladney (also Gledney). Or three eagles displayed sable. No motto. This is the original, paternal grant of arms to the distinguished old family of Gladney, prominent in history for many generations. The arms was granted and recorded in the old College of Arms in London prior to the seventeenth century. It is simple in design because of its antiquity and bears no motto as these had not come into use generally at that time, and none was added later as some families did. The eagle was called the 'king of birds' and as such was a much-favored charge or blazon on the arms. The eagle was the symbol of great strength, watchfulness and courage. The term 'displayed' means pictured with wings wide spread and facing the front.

The colors also had a meaning, as follows: Or (gold) showed stainless honor and elevation of mind. Sable (black) denoted dignity and sobriety. The leaves around the shield are used for decoration only and have no special meaning.

They have thirteen children: Margaret Lee Glass (3-10-1886)-(12-24-1975), Jessie Jane Glass (7-10-1887)-(3-7-1888), Cedic Glass (4-1-1889)-(10-24-1901), John Alexander Glass (1-11-1891)-(7-14-1976), Janie Arena Glass (10-7-1892)-(5-12-1894), Addie Enoree Glass (3-17-1895), Sallie Estelle Glass (2-4-1897), Mary Steele Glass (12-18-1898), Ruth Rodney Glass (12-22-1900)-(7-5-1940), Anna Elizabeth Glass (9-4-1902)-(1-15-1973), Josephine Miller Glass (1-10-1904), Julia Isabelle Glass (10-22-1906), and James Barry Glass (9-23-1909)-(10-17-1979), all born in York County, except Julia Isabelle and James Barry.

In December 1905, John Simpson and Julia Matilda Glass moved, with their eight living children, to the Mitford community of Fairfield County, where Julia Isabelle and James Barry were born. Margaret Lee married Barbara Ferguson Ford and moved to Great Falls. John Alexander never married and lived at the old home place near Mitford until his death. Addie Enoree married

Daniel Albert Oakes and moved to Florence. Sa Estelle married William Brown Lumpkin and moved to Neal Shoals. Mary Steele married Joseph Gordon Clo and moved to Columbia. Ruth Rodney never married and lived at the old home place until her death. A. Elizabeth married Robert Lee Moore and moved to Austin, Texas. Josephine Miller married Robert Ch Sharpe and moved to Columbia. Julia Isabelle married James Edgar Wrenn and moved to Great Falls. Ja Barry married Frances Clotilde Whitley and made th home in the Mitford community, until they moved to old Stewart place in the Mossy Dale community of F field County in January 1940.

James Barry and Frances Clotilde had th children: James Richard Glass (10-16-1932), John Pres Glass (9-10-1936), and Frances Rebecca Glass (6-10-1937). All three children attended Greenbrier High School. Ja Richard married Theresa Joan Plyler of Winnsboro December 23, 1953, and after twenty years in the U.S. Force returned to S.C. and settled in Sumter. They had three children: Patti June Glass (4-8-1956), Ja Richard Glass, Jr. (1-17-1958), and Anna Ruth Glass (1-17-1970). John Preston Glass married Alice June Plyler (twin sister of Theresa Joan Plyler) of Winnsboro, on October 13, 1956, and after twenty-three years in the U.S. Navy, settled in the Mossy Dale community of Fairfield County. They had two children: John Preston Glass, Jr. (9-22-1957) and George Barry Glass (7-4-1960). Frances Rebecca Glass married Ronnie Eugene Price of Fairfield County, on August 23, 1958, and they live in the Mossy Dale community of Fairfield County. They had two children: Ronnie Eugene Price, Jr. (6-27-1966) and Air Clotilde Price (12-14-1970).

Goudelock Family

James Russell Goudelock and Nancy Ferguson Goudelock, along with their children Betty, age 7, V., age 5, Bill, age 3½ and Steve, age 3 months, moved to Winnsboro in June of 1932 from Whitmire. James Goudelock was in the mercantile business. He had previously worked for the Public Service Commission and had bought out F.M. Roddey Mercantile (grocery business). The original store burned and a new one was built known as Nu Way Super Market in South Winnsboro. Goudelock also operated a dairy during these years, and had a cattle farm. Mr. Goudelock died in 1964.

Elizabeth (Betty) Ferguson Goudelock finished at Zion Institute and Winthrop College. She married William Gordon Cooper from Charleston in 1947 and moved to Charleston. They had one son. Betty died in 1964 from cancer.

Ella Virginia also finished Mt. Zion Institute and Winthrop College. She married Reese E. Griffin from Macon, Georgia, in December 1947. Reese is a Methu-
