## THE GOING FAMILY

The Going family which immigrated to America in about 1635 settled in the Virginia and Carolina Colonies.

One branch of the family was from Traverston in Tipperary, Ireland. Another branch is of Wigtown, Scotland, and claims the name is really Gowen in the old country and a very unusual name even in the midlands.

Many of the records of South Carolina list the name as Goyne. The family, therefore, arrived in America with a great variety of spellings. The name will be spelled as Going in this history.

Drury Going, ancestor of the following generations, lived in old Camden District of South Carolina. He is listed in the 1790 Chester County United States Census records, however 7 years later, his land plats are recorded in Union County.

The State of South Carolina was the eighth to enter the Union. This was in 1788, and more than 100 years before in 1683 three counties were established, namely, Berkeley, Colleton and Craven. All three were discontinued and in 1769 South Carolina was divided into seven judicial districts: Charleston, Georgetown, Beaufort, Orangeburg, Ninety Six, Camden and Cheraws.

The first six of these districts were given the names of the principal towns within their borders, and Cheraws got its name from the fact that the Cheraw Indians occupied much of the land before the white settlers moved there.

After South Carolina became a state, to the existing districts were added two more, namely, Pinckney and Washington. In 1798, these nine districts were divided into twenty-four. In 1768, Camden District had nine counties; in 1785, Camden District had seven counties.

If doing research in South Carolina, and you do not find your material in the county where you feel sure your ancestors lived, try another adjoining county. The tract of land may be located in one county and the conveyance record in another.
