ARCHIBALD MCCALESTER, late of Cape Fear in N. C., but at present of Charleston. Wife: Mary, brick mansion house and lot on N side Hasell St. where I now live, lot adjoining to W, plantation on Cape Fear River called Belville during her life, that due her from will of Caleb Grainger. Wife's son and dau: James Hasell Ancrum and Sarah Eliza Ancrum. Father: [not named]. Brothers: John and James McCalester. Sisters: [not named]. Mentions: possible unborn child; if I die near Cape Fear to be buried by my late wife at the W end of brick enclosure at bottom of garden at Belville; executors sell, if necessary, lot on S side Hasell St. and plan-
