DANIEL HALL, SR.

Daniel Hall, Sr., the seventh son of eight sons of John and Martha Gladden Hall, was born in 1803 in Fairfield County, S.C. He was a planter and slave-owner of a large volume. He was very prosperous. His plantations encompassed 6,000 acres of land in Fairfield and Chester Counties, S.C. He owned another plantation he called Blackjack six miles east of the Chester Courthouse. It is from Daniel Hall plantation that the community of Blackjack got its name. His plantation in Fairfield was called Hog Fork. He built a fine plantation home and reared a family of nine children. Daniel Hall was married first to Mary McCollough and second to Sarah Jane Hicklin. There were issue by both unions. He also owned a plantation in Blair, S.C. The home place is still in use. He had another plantation in Fernandina Beach, Fla. Daniel Hall and his brother, Dr. William E. Hall, gave the funds for the building of Bethesda Methodist Church in the Mitford Community of Fairfield County, S. C.
