That the said Charls Johnston for and in consideration of the sum of Ten Shillings Lawful current money of the State aforesaid to him in hand well and truly paid by the said Sibella Hall at and before this Sealing and delivery of those present the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge and to be well contain Satisfied and paid Have Granted Bargained aliene released Conveyed and Confirmed and by these presents do Grant Bargain Sell alien or remise release Convey and Confirm unto the said Isabella Hall in her actual possesion now being by Wirtue of a bargain and sale to her there of made for one whole year and by force of the Statute for Transferring of uses into possesion and to her Heirs and Assigns forever all this plantation or Tract of land containing on Hundred acres more or being the one half of the above ment'd Tract bounding on the said Creek at the mouth of a Branch near (?Dunlaps?) pond and so bounding by that Branch across the said Survey Together with all and Singular the Housed Out Houses Edifices Buildings Barns Stables Yards Gardens orchards woods under woods Timbir and Timbir Trees meadows pastures ponds Lakes Trailways ways waters water courses paths passages Liberties--privileges profits Hired it rights numbers and appurtinances whatsoever there unto-belonging or in anywise assertaining and the reversion or reversions remainder and remainders Rents Issues and profits there of and of every part and parsel and all the Estate Right Title Interest use Trust possesion property profit benefit claims demand whatsoever of him the said Charles Johnston of into or out of the same promises every part there of and all deeds Evidences -- Escripts Writings whatsoever touching on concerning the same premisis and every part there of To Have and to Hold the said plantation or Tract of Land of one Hundred acres as aforesaid with every the primeses and in assurtienances there unto belonging herein before Granted released and Conveyed unto the said Sibella Hall her Heirs and assigns forever to the only proper and absolute use and behoof of the said Sibella Hall her Heirs and assigns and the the said Charles Johnston doth hereby for himself his Heirs Exrs admrt and assigns Covenant promise and agree to and with the said Sibella Hall her Heirs and assigns in manner and form following that is to say that he the said Charles Johnston now is and until the Execution of these presents shall stand Seized of a good Sure perfect and indefeasible right of Inheritance in fee Simple of and in all the aforesaid plantation or Tract of onehundred acres of Land with the rights numbers and appurts without any manner of Condition Trust Mortgage Judgment Execution or Incumbrance whatsoever to alter change or determine the same and also that the said Sibella Hall her Heirs and assigns shall and may from time to time and at all times hereafter peacably and quietly have hold use occupy posses and enjoy the said plantation or Tract of Land of one Hundred acres with every premises and appurtenances thereunto belonging without any manner of Trouble Hindrance Molestation add denial of him the said Charles Johnston his Heirs or assigns and of all and every other person or persons whatsoever and Lastly Charles Johnston for himself his Heirs Executors and administrators the said plantation or Tract of one Hundred acres of land with the presmises and appurtenances unto the said Sibella Hall her Heirs and assigns against him the said Charles Johnston. his Heirs and assigns and all and every other person and persons shall and will warrant and forever defend-by these presents In Witness whereof the said Charles Johnston shall
