Traditionally John Hall, and his widowed mother, Ceybella "Sibbie", accompanied her brothers, John and Moses Hallis, from Virginia to Fairfield County before the Revolutionary War. It is believed Capt. Thomas Hall (died 1782) who served with General Marion, also came with them.

John Hall served <sup>some time</sup> in the last years of the Revolution. He married Martha Gladden (1765-1842) about 1784. Their children were Darlington (1785), ~~##~~ Mansel (1788), Thomas (1790-1847), a local Methodist Minister for twenty-five years, John (1791-1831), Laban (1796), Martha (1798), who married Rev. Samuel Stokes, William (1801) M.D., Daniel (1803-1887), Sarah (1806-1822), Reuben (1807) and Sibbie who died ~~her~~ <sup>young</sup>. These children married locally and later some of moved to various southern states. The means to erect a brick building for Bethesda Methodist Church were donated mainly by Mr. William Hall and his brother Daniel.

Remaining in Fairfield County, Daniel Hall first married Mary McCullough (1810-1856) in 1827. They had three sons and one daughter. His second marriage in 1858 was to Sara Jane Wicklin (1835-1913). Their children were Mary Isabella (d. 1863) James Lee (d. 1864) both died young, Daniel (1859-1936) married first Frances Elizabeth Mobley (1860-1925) - second to Mamie McDonald, Susan Irene (1866-1919) married first Rev. Robinson, - second to William McCreeg and Jason Hecklin (1873-1953) un-married.
