the citation of Thomas Hall in 1782 was read by Ralph Jones. I then  
checked Townsend's History of the Baptists and found that Ralph Jones  
was the minister at Wateree Creek Church, 5½ miles South of Winnsboro,  
Wateree and Dutchman's Creek. How firm is your evidence that John  
Hall (1730-1780) was father of John Hall (1765-1834)?)

You would like to know:

If John's father was there early? And where did he get his land?

You also mention:

The John Hall of Philadelphia with deeds in 1794 and 1795 had a wife Prudence. His will dated 21 Mar. 1783 in Camden records. You will see later in this report that the John Hall of the will of 1783 died in 1784.

You sent the Indirect Deed Index for Fairfield Co., S. C. beginning with Book Q, p. 57. You sent abstracts of Book I, p. 176, p. 218. There are other listings: Book I, p. 185, p. 194, p. 196, p. 197. I do not know to what extent you did the Direct Index or references. All of these would need to be done and all for the surname in the county for complete coverage. From the references you sent, John Hall is deeding from land granted to John Agnew. Obviously, one John Hall had a plat in 1767 for 350 acres. I would need to do the combined computer index to see if he had a grant for this or filed a Memorial. It's possible that the land was inherited or a conveyance may be found much, much later. At some point, someone is going to have to do this complete search.

Search of my Hall File:

Richland Co., S. C. Chancery Bill 104:

John Hall, Jr. and his wife lived in Camden before the Revolution. Mr. Hall died there. He left a widow and 2 children. Mrs. Hall moved to Virginia. She returned to Camden after some years with Dr. Charlton whom she married in Virginia and by whom she had several children. Mr. James Munford came and settled in Camden about 1784 and married Miss Hall the daughter of John Hall, Jr. dec'd. and moved to Georgia about 1791.

There was an early colonial family of Halls in South Carolina. In fact, several--one in Charleston--one in Williamsburg Co., S. C.

Ainsley Hall of Richland Co., S. C. was born in England 1783 and died in Virginia in 1823. He is buried in the First Presbyterian Church, Columbia, S. C. He married Sarah Cook Goodwyn. Ainsley Hall had a brother, William Hall.

Samuel Hall came on the PENNSYLVANIA FARMER. 150 acres 1773. Craven Co., S. C.

John Hall came on the FREE MASON. 250 acres 1773. Craven Co., S. C.

Notes on Hall of Bute Co., N. C. and Southampton, Va.

You have Darlington Hall b. 1785 as child of John Hall & Martha Gladden. Is this Darlington or Darling? Lucy Ann, daughter of Darling Jones, married Major James Goodwin/Goodwyn. Weren't Goodwyns and John Hall involved in deeds in Fairfield Co., S. C.?

What needs to be done:

A search of all deeds and estates in Fairfield Co., S.C. under surname Hall. This should clear up the John Hall of Philadelphia. He could not be the John Hall who died in 1784. A brief search in York Co., S. C. where he also had land may produce the name of his wife.

A search of the combined computer index to secure additional data on the 350 acres of John Hall on the Wateree in 1767.

What needs to be done, cont'd.:

John Agnew seems vital to your search.

The tract of Moses Hollis by indenture to John Hall in 1783 (at which time John Hall b. 1765 was age 18-- and not proved until 1794--after death of his mother) seems close to the Charles Johnston tract and the 153 acres surveyed for John Hall in 1793 bounded: John Agnews, Hugh Lavender, John Hall, Charles Johnston, and Jesse Jenkins. And see by 1824-37, bounded: Joseph Caldwell, Minor Gladden, Lucy Lavender, Elijah Gaydin.

How does John Hall have title to John Agnew's land?

See Ralph Jones M.H. on part of Mills' Atlas Map enclosed. Citation for Thomas Hall was read here in 1782. Meeting Houses and stores were often used as places for public notice. It did not necessarily mean that the person was a member of that church. Col. Hall is noted on Mills' in the western part of the county.

Need to explore John Agnew and his grant of 1774.

Settlers in this area came early and later. The Halls noted on page 7 of this report may have come with the Rev. William Martin and his group. McMaster's History of Fairfield Co., S. C. gives much information and includes the special state census of 1829, Mills' Statistics, and other interesting items. Most of these are too late for your purposes.

There is another "set" of Halls in Anderson Co., S. C. Hall Township was named for that family. The Rev. Nathaniel Hall, a Baptist Minister, from Virginia. His son, John Hall gained the nickname of "Stone Fence Hall," as he was the first to use stones found on the farm, for making stone fences. The great grandson, Zachariah was a man of great means and education;... (From Names in South Carolina.)

In addition to the deeds, estates, and other court records of Fairfield Co., S. C., there are collections of church and cemetery records which could be explored.

I don't know to what extent you looked at my Stokes files when you were here. In 1830, Samuel Stokes was living right in the midst of this Hall family, and if Mr. Andrea's abstract of Mrs. Martha Gladden Hall's will of 1840 is correct, the daughter, Patsy (Martha) Stokes was dead by 1840.

Some years ago, I did a little project on the Knighton family. Thomas Knighton (1746-1828) of Fairfield Co. will 1825.

Nothing in my file showed anything on the families of your interest. As you will note, this family was living in the same area as your John Hall. You have that John Hall md. Martha Knitchen (could this be Knighton?) and John Hollis md. Katherine Knighton. All of these apparently a generation older than Thomas Knight above.

You show that Delphia Porter, wife of Mansel Whitson Hall, was a cousin. Also, the 1795 deed to John Hall of Philadelphia shows 98 acres originally granted to David Porter. In another research project, I was asked to prove that Flora Brownfield married David Porter, and that David Porter had a dau. Ann b. 1782 who md. John Gaston. I am checking that file. The Brownfields came from County Antrim, Ireland and settled in Pennsylvania. Some to Mecklenburg Co., N. C. Some to S. C. Flora Brownfield married David Porter and had:

In reviewing the York Co., S. C. deeds I did on Porter, I note:

1794. David Porter of York ...Renunciation of Dower  
by Isabell Porter.

1800. David Porter, Sr. & Isabell his wife...of York.

1791. Power of Attorney. Hannah Bishop, widow of  
Chester to David Porter, planter of York, S. C. ...  
"especially to adjust and settle the estate of father,  
Thomas Braken, late of Pennsylvania."

Chester Co., S. C.:

1786. David Porter and Florah his wife....

(Note: This David was dead by 1821 when his heirs signed  
a deed.)

Will of David Porter, Sr. York Co., S. C. 1801. Wife  
Isabel. Sons: James, William, John. Daughter: Peggy.  
Sons: David, Francis.

Will of John Porter, Chester Co., S. C. Wife Jane.  
1795. No daughter named Delphia.

The data on Porter, Knighton, etc. is just so much "miscellany."  
Certainly, the prime target of this project--the Hall family--  
has not come to "a dead end." It will be essential to do at a  
minimum a complete search of all of the surname in Fairfield Co.,  
S. C. There is no telling what could be in the body of a deed  
or in the estate papers. I think we have cleared up the family  
of John Hall (1737-1784) and Prudence (1743-1839) of York Co.,  
S. C. The John Hall of Philadelphia should be identifiable from  
the deeds of Fairfield and York Co., S. C. Colonial records  
for John Hall (plat of 1767) will need to be searched...to see  
what happened to this tract. It's possible that the family never  
lived on this tract. The John Hall we can identify was only 2  
years old at this time. I had a case where the original tract  
was never lived on and was disposed of by the grandchildren over  
50 years after it was granted. In addition to the plat, we should  
find a grant, a memorial, payment of quit rents--and prior to that  
a petition to council.

I will be happy to continue in any manner you suggest and to the  
extent of your advance. It's possible that some of the descendants  
still in the area would be willing to undertake the detailed searches  
which will be necessary, and I'll be glad to cooperate in any way  
that I can.
