Dear Ms Stevenson:

Please refer to copy of your letter of June 10, 1992 in which you enclosed a copy of The Harrison Family and a zerox copy of the Will of Reuben Harrison.

I have found some more information regarding The Harrison family. First, I have found out that **REUBEN HENRY HARRISON** who married 1st **SARAH BURGESS** [probably the daughter of Demsey Burgess). Sarah was the mother of all of Reuben Henry Harrison's children. After Sarah's death, Reuben married **Nancy Kirkland 2nd**. I do not know who Nancy Kirkland's parents were.

SARAH 'Sally' HARRISON, sister of Reuben Henry Harrison, married Thomas Davis in South Carolina on 1 Jan 1768. Sarah (Harrison) Davis was born 10 Mar 1752 in South Carolina. She died in Greene Co., TN 17 Feb 1824. I have been unable to find a marriage bond for them.

REUBEN HENRY HARRISON was born in South Carolina in 1760.

WILLIAM HARRISON who married **ANN KIRKLAND** was their parents.

William Harrison (the father) was born 31 Dec 1714 in Fairfax County, VA. He died in 1774 in Craven County, SC. (I don't think this county is in existence now) I was able to obtain two wills for **WILLIAM HARRISON** (1714-1774) from the South Carolina Archives. The first Will dated 25 July 1769 - Will Book 1774=1779, p. 77 (not proven), Craven County, S.C. The 2nd will was dated 16 Dec 1773 and Proven 15 Apr 1774, Craven County, S.C. Mentioned in William Harrison's will was his wife **ANN**, children: daughter **Mary McKenny**, son **James Harrison**, son **Willibee Harrison**, daughter **Sarah Davis**, son **REUBEN HARRISON**, and daughter **Patience Harrison**.

It is thought that William (1714-1774) and Ann Kirkland in all probability were married in Virginia [probably Fairfax Co. VA] but have not found this yet.

Ann Kirkland was the daughter of /^{capt} Richard ~~Snowden~~ Kirkland and _____ ? Her brother was Moses Kirkland, the Tory. Ann's Grandfather was ~~Richard~~ Richard Kirkland. There were probably other children. His wife was Mary. Capt. Richard Kirkland was born 29 Jul 1705 in Anne Arundel, Maryland, and died 1742-3 in Fairfax County, VA. Will dated 17 Nov 1742, Will Book A-1 Part 1, 1742-1752, proven 19 May 1743, Fairfax Co., Virginia. Mentioned in will was his wife Mary, children: Richard, Robert, John, & Edward. Mention was made of sons and daughters (not mentioned by name). I have a copy of Capt. Richard Kirkland from Fairfax Co., VA.

"Mary Harrison signed a marriage contract in Glynn Co., GA on 2 FEB 1807 with Thomas Muse of Fairfield Dist., SC. All of her property (land and slaves from the division of her father's est.) was to be held in trust for her use, clear of her husband's debts and contracts; trustees were Abraham Belton of Kershaw Dist., SC, and Athelston Dawson Lawrence of Glynn Co. Within the year she died leaving a 20-day old infant, husband, and sister (unnamed). On 12 JUN 1807 Thomas Muse applied as next-of-kin to administer the estate of John Harrison, dec'd. planter of St. Simons, in place of Mrs. Martha Harrison; on 17 June 1808 Muse applied again as next-of-kin to administer the estate of James Harrison, dec'd., but this was evidently denied. Glynn Co., GA Deeds, Book ABEF, 465; Deed Book C, 51; CMSA, 12 June 1807; RSEL 12 Jan 1808; Cate, Our Today's, 255, 262." Will mentions his wife Ann, and his children in this order: eldest daughter Mary McKenney, eldest son James Harrison, son Willibee, daughter Sarah Davis, son Reuben Harrison, daughter Patience Harrison.

JAMES² HARRISON was the eldest son of WILLIAM¹ and ANN (KIRKLAND) HARRISON.

Since William¹ Harrison listed first his eldest daughter Mary, then listed eldest son James second - then James was probably William¹ and Ann (KIRKLAND) HARRISON'S second child.
